STRIKING LASTERS LOOK FOR TROUBLE

LYNN, Mass., Oct. 9.—The 1,200 lasters who went on strike in 54 shoe factories of this city at noon yesterday, lost no time in starting a campaign in an effort to add to their ranks the men who still remained at their machines, and in the afternoon the first of a series of demonstrations was held. About 1,000 strikers gathered at the Union headquarters and marched to the factory of Hennessey and Thompson, at West Lynn, where the lasters remained at work. Finding the gates to the factory locked, they gathered in front of the building and made a great uproar urging the men to quit. Finally one of the lasters in the factory jumped out of a window and standing on the fence in front of the building made a speech to the strikers. He was an Armenian and in broken English he said that he and the majority of the lasters sympathized with the strikers, but that at noon time, when the strike was declared, the gates of the building were closed, and the men were locked in. Concluding his remarks he jumped off the fence into the crowd, and called to his fellow workers to follow him, which most of them did. Afterwards many of the Hennessey and Thompson lasters started back to their room after their kits, but were refused admittance.

MET FOR FIRST TIME AND MARRIED AT ONCE.

LAPEER, Mich., Oct. 9.—In the presence of 40 curiously married people, Mary M. Ralston, aged 71 years, of Detroit, became the wife of Lemuel Rutherford, Arcadia, 75 years old. Justice Wright tied the knot. The bridegroom never saw the bride until the day of the wedding, when she came from Detroit in response to his request. He had advertised for a wife.

TRIUMPH OF SCIENCE WINS SAVANT A BRIDE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9.—When Dr. Ladislaus Detre, the noted Hungarian scientist, who has been a conspicuous figure at the International Congress on Tuberculosis, proved to the world that he had discovered a new way of diagnosing the disease he was able to claim for his bride Miss Lillian Coblenzer, one of the prettiest girls in Washington. The promise of Miss Coblenzer to become his wife depended upon Dr. Detre proving his theory conclusively to his associates in the congress which he did last Friday afternoon with the aid of eleven victims of consumption who were brought to the convention hall from a local tuberculosis hospital.

VANCOUVER GETS MAGNIFICENT PARK

OTTAWA, Ont., Oct. 9.—An order in council has been passed giving to the city of Vancouver a perpetual lease of Stanley Park, one of the finest natural parks on the continent and famous among tourists all over the world.

The city has been negotiating with the government for years with a view to securing control of the park, but the chief difficulty has been over the question of granting the lease to a commission appointed jointly by the city and the government.

It has now finally been decided by the government that the city should be safely entrusted to assume sole control of the park and keep it intact as park property. A similar lease has been granted to the city giving the old admiralty reserve near Barnet as a city jail site.

EIGHT ITALIANS WERE KILLED

WATERBURY, Conn. Oct. 9.—Four Italians were killed by illuminating gas which leaked into their sleeping rooms in an Italian boarding house last night. In addition to those killed eight men and two women were found unconscious or partly so from the gas fumes.

FISCAL FEDERATION WOULD BRIND THE EMPIRE.

LONDON, Oct. 9.—Dr. Muspratt, President of the Financial Reform Association, in a letter to the press says the recent discussion at a meeting of the Canadian manufacturers in Montreal ought to convey a warning to those who indulge in the hope that if we impose a duty on foreign goods coming into Britain while admitting the colonial free a great market will be provided to our manufacturers within the empire.

Dr. Muspratt believes that, so far as political results are concerned, the fiscal federation of the mother country and colonies, in place of binding the empire together, will sow the seeds of discord that in a short time will rend it to pieces.
