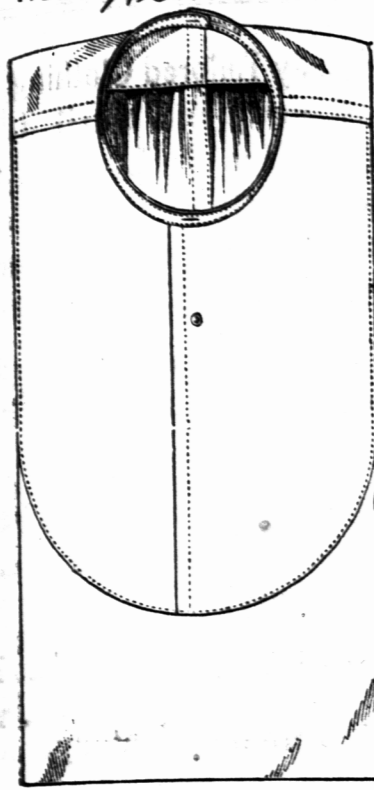

The Campbellton, N. B. Telephone says the news that Thos. Kerr, Esq. had passed away at 5.30 o'clock Thursday morning was learned with regret by the citizens of Campbellton. Being a gentleman who held many important offices he was a conspicuous person in the town's history. He was always a very hearty gentleman, but was attacked with muscular rheumatism last fall which kept him bedfast all winter and about three weeks ago he took an apparent change and sank gradually till his demise. He died very peacefully and was quite conscious to the last. Born in Bathurst in June, 1824, he moved to Campbellton some 15 years later and made Campbellton his permanent home. He leaves two sons William of Boston, and Frederick G. now of Presque Isle Me, who has spent considerable time with his father during the latter's illness; and four daughters: Mrs. N. McDougall, of Springhill; Mrs. A. W. K. Herdman, of Georgetown, P. E. I. Mrs. Alex. Mowat and Miss Kerr, of Campbellton. The funeral will take place from the late residence of the deceased at 2.20 local, Saturday afternoon. On hearing of her father's illness Mrs. Herdman left last week for Campbellton, but the end came before she could reach his bedside.

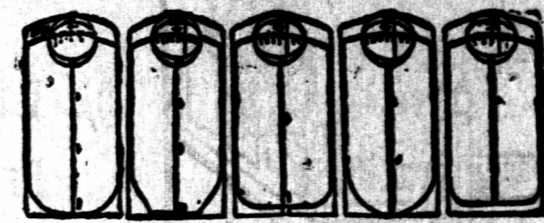
