ANNUITY THAT IS WAITING FOR A CLAIMANT

Search For His To a Pension Granted By Fugitive King

LONDON, Jan. 5.—Diligent systematic search is being made by a firm of London solicitors for the heir of an annuity granted by Charles I. to a farmer named Perrell, who sheltered the King after the disastrous Battle of Worcester.
 "Honest Richard Perrell" was a farmer as the Staffordshire farmer who, with the assistance of his four brothers, risked death at the hand of the pursuing Roundheads by hiding him among the foliage of an oak tree—famous as "the Boscobel"—while the soldiers searched vainly for him at its foot.
 The gratitude of the King to a practical farmer, upon his return to power, rewarded his preservers, and incidentally, wreaked a subtle vengeance upon his enemies by taxing certain Roundhead lands to produce an annuity of £500 for Richard Perrell and his descendants.
 Should the heir be discovered and his identity proved, he will receive, in addition to a portion of the annuity, a considerable sum of money which has accumulated.
