YNOPS IS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST

Any numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of the family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agent for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader.
