If Baby Runs A Temperature

NOWADAYS everybody should know how to take a temperature. A simple, accurate, clinical thermometer, with a nurse. The normal temperature is 98 degrees Fahrenheit, and if Baby is running a temperature of more than 98 degrees, it is restless, unable to feed, takes no risks, but send for the doctor without delay. It may be nothing, or it may be the commencement of an illness and early care may make all the difference.

CLEAN CLOTHES He must have clean clothes and his bed made in the night and morning. You need to safeguard Baby, and the most likely way of causing these is to overheat him during the night. Keep him in a clean, cool, and airy room. His nightgown must be made of lightweight material which will not restrict his movements. His bed clothes must be heavy.

Curing Meat

To be successfully cured meat must not retain any of its animal heat nor should it be placed in a cure while it is frozen. A great deal of meat is lost every year because the meat has either not been cooled properly — possibly because the weather is not cool enough — or because it is not properly cured.

ANEMIA IN PIGS

If sucking pigs 2 to 6 weeks of age are unthriftily, eat sparingly, or generally lack vigor or vitality or if "humps" are evident, and they breathe quickly — it may mean anemia. And anemia often causes sudden death and a higher pig mortality. Sucking pigs may be treated for anemia by giving them weekly doses of about a teaspoonful per pig of an iron and copper salt solution.
