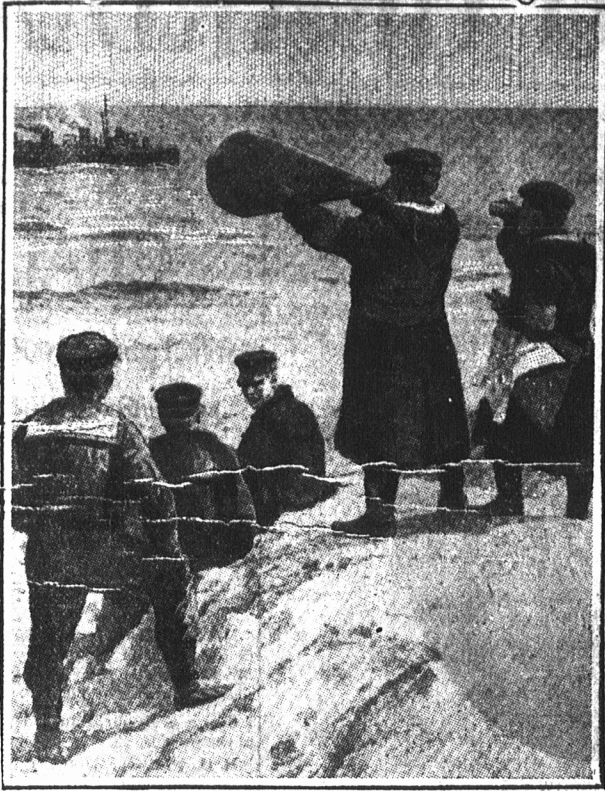

Famous Delineator of Children.

Hilda Cowham has been famous as a humorous delineator of children for a long time now. She possesses the unique distinction of being the only lady artist whose work has ever figured in "Punch." In this year's "Almanack" there is a full-page picture by Mrs. G. F. Armour of the Punch contributors' meet, to "draw the covers" of 1904. There is only one lady among that famous "hunt"; and she is Hilda Cowham, on a fiery black charger. In private life Miss Cowham is Mrs. Edgar Lander. Her husband is also a black-and-white artist of repute, having contributed pictorially to Punch, besides scores of other well-known journals. Mr. and Mrs. Lander met at the Lambeth Art School, where they both served their apprenticeship to illustration work. Hilda Cowham is a slim young lady, with a clever face, big dark eyes, and an unusual wealth of dark hair. She is a rapid worker. "I prefer flat-color work and painting in oils to black-and-white," she says. "But I can't desert my spindle-legged children, because editors are continually asking for them."—London Star.

A Peasage Romance.

The Daily Mirror says: The strange complications of the Gardner peasage, which has been dormant since the death of the third baron without male issue, will shortly once more come before the House of Lords. In the early part of the last century, Stewart William Gardner, a grandson of Rear-Admiral Lord Gardner, lived in the southwest provinces of India, and contracted a marriage with a native woman, and begat numerous descendants. In 1884, soon after the third baron died, the eldest of these colored descendants sought to take his seat in the House of Lords, but the Lord Chancellor decided an enquiry must be held into his claims. On the death of his father, in 1901, Alan Hyde Gardner, who also claims the title through a collateral branch, proceeded to India to obtain evidence as to the validity of the marriage on which the title of the Indian claimant depends. He is advised that the result of his enquiries clears the way to the success of his own claim to the peasage.

Smallest Store in New York.

The smallest business house in New York city is a little tailor shop located at 13 North William street, a small thoroughfare just east of the bridge and off Park row. The actual inside measurements of the little shop are 3 feet 9 inches by 4 feet 2 inches, and there is just room for a small gas stove and two three legged stools. On one of these the tailor sits at his work. The other is for the waiting customer, for the business in this shop is mainly in the nature of emergency repairs. If there should be a rush of two customers, one of them would be obliged to remain outside until his turn came. The shop from the outside looks bigger than it is, for on the wall there is a showcase filled with garments, which looks like a store front. It is, however, part of the wall. For this tiny little shop the lessees, a father and son, pay \$75 per month rental and make a living besides. Only one of the men is in the store at a time for obvious reasons.—New York World.

Mr. Morley's Arithmetic.

Mr. Algernon Ashton draws attention to the following curious passage in Mr. John Morley's biography of Gladstone: "He (Disraeli) was five years older (perhaps more) than Mr. Gladstone." What did Mr. Morley mean by that phrase, "perhaps more?" Gladstone was born on Dec. 29, 1809, Disraeli on Dec. 21, 1804. The difference between the two men's ages was, therefore, just five years. The only explanation seems to be that Oxford scholars, however distinguished, are not very strong on arithmetic!

French Red Tape.

Recently the time arrived for G. Stern, the leading jockey of France, to take his term of service in the French army. He made application to enter a cavalry regiment. The authorities at the War Office have refused his request. The reason given is that Stern has only one year to serve and that it is impossible to form an efficient cavalryman in less than three years! This incident is believed to establish a new record in the working of red tapeism.
