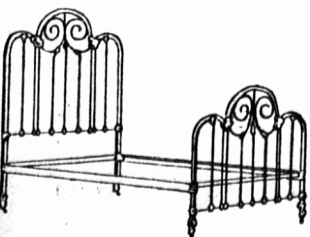

THE SUNDAY OBSERVANCE BILL.

At this writing it is quite impossible to state the details of the Sunday Observance Bill as it will be enacted into law. The legislation was reluctantly undertaken by the Government and only because a decision of the Privy Council had made it clear that Sunday legislation was a matter for the federal Parliament and not for the provincial Legislatures. The reluctance of those in authority arose from the differing view of large sections of the Canadian people as to the duties and privileges of the day.

The Government is deserving of credit for having grappled with the difficult question and made an honest endeavor to bring something like order out of the chaos that would continue to exist were not some federal law enacted. They are the more deserving of credit in the premises from the fact that it was quite impossible to make political capital out of it, and from the first there was a moral certainty of displeasing many persons. The law will of necessity be the result of compromises.

To the mass of people of Quebec and to a less extent to the people of the Northwest and the Pacific coast the law will be thought too restrictive. The French-speaking people of Quebec have been long used to recreation on the Sunday after attending church. Political addresses in election campaigns are delivered at the church doors on Sunday. Games and sports, including horse races, are held on that day, together with theatrical entertainments, and at these pastimes in many cases admission fees have been charged. One clause of the new act strikes at the latter feature.

Strong opposition to the measure has come from the railway and transportation interests, the manufacturing and mining interests, which are exceedingly powerful in the country. Less influential but still strong opposition has come from the Jews and Adventists whose conscientious convictions require them to observe the seventh day, Saturday, instead of the first day of the week, and they feel it to be a hardship to remain compulsorily idle on two days of the seven. Through all these difficulties there appears to have been an honest effort made to preserve one day in the seven as a day of rest from labor, and on which those disposed to worship shall be left free to engage therein without disturbance. Transportation and the great industries will feel to a considerable extent the checks imposed by the new law, but in its general scope it will allow somewhat greater freedom to the individual than the hitherto existing Sunday laws in Ontario and the Maritime Provinces. It seems regrettable that each Province

could not have been permitted to make and keep its own Sunday laws, but the constitution as interpreted by the highest tribunal does not permit of such a course. Besides it would be impracticable for the provincial Legislatures to deal with such matters as railway trains and steamers passing from one Province to another, or from a foreign country to Canada and vice versa. But it is to be observed that those who regard the Fourth Commandment of the Decalogue as of higher authority than any merely human enactment, will be protected in their observance of one day in the seven for rest and worship. If this is not all that might be desired, it is much.

In reply to Mr. Martin, M. P. Hon. Mr. Fisher the other day said he thought Prince Edward Island had one of the earliest claims to an experimental farm station.

P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association Examination

The board of examiners of the P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association will meet for the purpose of examining candidates offering for registration on July 30, 1906. Every candidate for examination shall satisfy the council that he has served as assistant in a drug store for not less than four years and at least two of these years has been employed in the dispensing of prescriptions. Candidates must give notice to the Secretary-Registrar in writing, of their intention to present themselves for examination at least fifteen days before the date fixed for the examination. Such notice must be accompanied by examination fee of \$5.00, and by certificate to the satisfaction of the Council that the candidate possesses the qualifications above described. Any person entering his name and not presenting himself at the time and place fixed for the examinations shall forfeit his fee to the Association.
