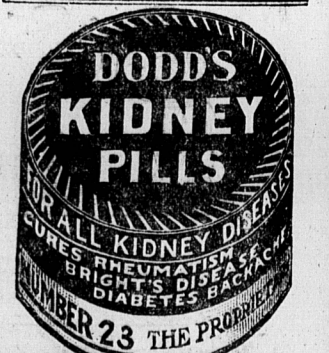

HORSE NOTES. The clerk stated that results of the ballot on Church Union had been received from all the congregations within the bounds except Princetown and Richmond Bay, East. Results are as follows:— Question 1—Are you in favor of Organic Union with the Methodist and Congregational Churches? Elders 182 37 Members 3174 726 Adherents 1853 363 Totals 5239 1126 Majority for union 4113. Question 2—Do you approve of the proposed Basis of Union? Elders 169 39 Members 3174 726 Adherents 1604 315 Totals 4677 1086 Majority for Basis 3641. These results tabulated on regular form, were ordered to be forwarded to the clerk of the General Assembly. Presbytery adjourned to meet at the call of the Moderator and clerk of which Public Intimation was made and this sederunt was closed with the benediction. A. CRAIGIE, Presbytery Clerk.

MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY. At Charlottetown, and within St. James' Hall there, on Tuesday, the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, at half-past eleven o'clock in the forenoon, the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island, met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted by Mr. W. H. Spencer, Moderator pro tempore, besides whom were present Messrs. D. B. McLeod, John Gillis, A. Craige, ministers, and Lieutenant Governor Rogers, elder. An intimation from the Presbytery of Victoria, B. C., in regard to the application of a minister of another denomination for reception into the Presbyterian Church in Canada, and to be laid before the General Assembly was read. The clerk submitted the report on statistics for the year ending December thirty-first, 1911, which was received and adopted. The following are the principal items of this report:— Number of congregations 33. Number of families 3819. Number of communicants 6030. Number received on profession 213. Number received by certificate 51. Number enrolled in Sabbath Schools and Bible Classes, 4653. Stipend paid by congregation, \$27,042.00. Payments for all mission purposes, \$12,902.00. Total for all purposes raised by congregations and their organizations, \$67,364.00. Actual value of church property, \$269,400.00.
