Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may hereinafter be called a "settler" and is eligible to obtain a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the intending homesteader.

Unles—Six months' residence, upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.

MR. DOULL REJOINS.

Sir:—I have refrained for a few days from answering A. E. Morrison's last letter, not wishing to crowd the little controversy too persistently on the public. He has now let in the desired light. Just why he wrote is now apparent.

Now a few facts. Over twenty-five years ago the inter-stellar darkness theory was forced on my mind through my electric experimenting. From eighteen to twenty years I have been trying to persuade others of its truth. Some four to six years ago Mr. M. read a paper on "Dust" before the Natural History Society, from which he now publishes extracts. Four to six is "some years ago," but is that sufficient to justify him in writing in such a way as to lead the public to think that I was stealing his thunder, and claiming unfounded priority?

So much for priority, now for originality. I have never claimed to be the first to believe or promulgate the theory. The first man I ever spoke to of my belief (I chose my man) told me there was a class of scientists who believed it. Indeed it was taught in at least one of the St. John, N. B. schools fifty years ago. Yet, as far as I personally am concerned it was as completely original as if I had been the first to think of it.

As I have said, it was forced on me by my experimenting and I have never seen a word or argument put forward in print except those referred to in my first letter.

Mr. Morrison's paper never appeared in print and if it had it does not touch the matter at all. There is no such difference between the staff he writes and the inter-stellar darkness theory as between chalk and cheese. I trust I have made matters clear both as to priority and originality. Will Mr. Morrison now come forward and as plainly tell us whether he originated or borrowed the absurdities set out in his paper?

ST. JOHN, Feb. 3.—Allan Line steamship Hesperian, which left this port last Friday for Liverpool, took away 191,414 bushels, the largest shipment of wheat so far this season.
