

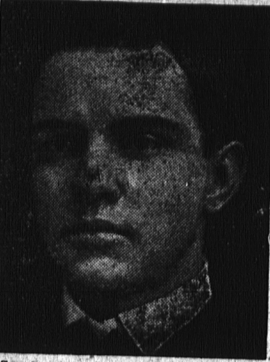

A Talk on Tweeds



Year by year the task of determining whether a piece of cloth is all-wool or mixed with cotton and shoddy is becoming more difficult. Many lines are sold for pure wool which have more or less cotton in them. So clever, indeed, are the imitations, even experts are puzzled at times, and the burning-test has to be resorted to in order to disclose the presence of any foreign thread.

Try this test for yourself. See if some of the supposedly "pure wool" doesn't burn like cotton. Pull out two or three strands from any cloth you wish to prove, twist them together, and apply a lighted match. If it's pure wool, there will be a quick flare of flame, then a crumbling, charred, black mass. Wool won't burn if you take the flame away. If it's mixed goods, the cotton will burn a clear yellow all the way to the end.

The cause of numerous diseases and disagreeable habits, heretofore ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Blisters, drooling, frothing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one rein and pulling are very often due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth lacerate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. Decayed teeth should be removed by extracting or trepanning, sharp corners and rough edges should be smoothed down, and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The common float, or file heretofore deemed sufficient accomplish this, will not suffice special instruments devised for purpose are necessary. 4-25drf

ARREARS OF TAXES.

NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

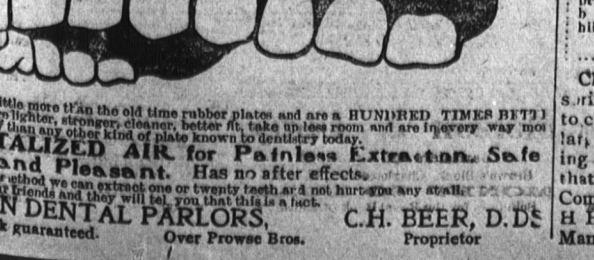
Notice is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1907, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of arrears of Taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of arrears of 1906 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same nor the mailing of Final Notices to Defaulters; and it gives the Government the additional power, after the Tax is one month over due, of suing in any Court, and of levying on all goods and chattels found on the premises or in possession of the party sued. Where there are no goods and chattels, or not sufficient to levy on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

The new Act, as well as the old, declares all taxes to be "Crown debts," having priority over all other Claims, Judgments, Mortgages, Bills of Sale, etc. All Taxes will be sued for in the name of the King.

Persons in arrears for Land, Road or Income Tax are requested to make immediate payment to save expenses.

FRENCH PRESS WELL PLEASED

PARIS, May 8.—The French Press received with general satisfaction the announcement that negotiations are in progress between France and Japan looking to an understanding guaranteeing the political and commercial interests of the two powers in the far East, as leaving France of danger of the loss of Indo-China, and as serving all the nations with interests in the far East. The papers also recognize in the approaching understanding a triumph for British diplomacy. The "Petit Parisien" considers that the intent involves "Japanese renunciation of the Monroe Doctrine of Asia for the Asiatics." And the "Gil Blas" while maintaining the agreement is not directed against any particular country, contends that it constitutes, "a warning for the power which is excluded."
