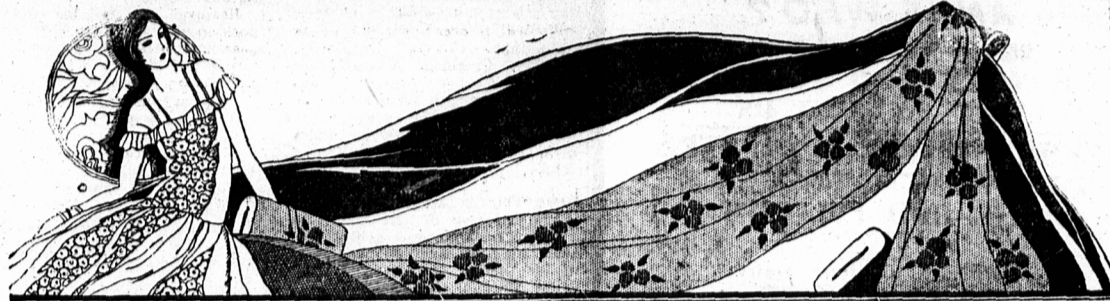

PLAN WORK FOR CHURCH.—On Monday evening, April 19th, the United Church of Canada people associated with Cornwall congregation met in their church there to organize. This congregation comprises the old Methodist charge that district, together with the Union people of Clyde River, who withdrew from the Presbyterian Church there last summer to allow the non-concurrent members full freedom in making their own plans. The pastor, Rev. G. U. MacNevin, occupied the chair and after some discussion, it was decided that plan "B", as outlined in "The Basis of Union," be the plan followed in organizing. A session of five was chosen. Messrs. Hugh McMillan and Hector Murchison, the two former Presbyterian elders, were received as representing the former Presbyterians, while Messrs. Wm. Boyle, Geo. Crawley, and Harry Hyde, were elected to represent the former Methodists. A strong committee of stewards was also elected. They are as follows: Messrs. Wm. Boyle, George Boyle, Brewer Boyle, John Boyle, Pope Crosby, Jos. H. Drake, Len Drake, Samuel Frizell, Herb. Frizell, Frank Howard, Herb. Howard, Wesley Hood, Fred Hyde, John McKinnon, Gordon McMillan, Malcolm McPhail and Harry Pethick. Officers for the Sunday School were then chosen. They are Superintendent, Mr. Harry Hyde; assistant superintendent, Mr. Golding Smith; sec. mess, Mr. Herb. Frizell; organist, Miss Lillian Hyde; superintendent of Temperance and Missionary Education, Mr. Hector Murchison. The congregation is a large part of the old Cornwall circuit which combined with the West and Clyde River congregation last July to form a united charge under the joint pastorate of Rev. H. Pierce and Rev. C. U. MacNevin. It was tried as an experiment and has met with good success. The work in all branches has moved along most harmoniously. The Sunday services are very well attended and in addition two week-night services are being held. Throughout the winter at Thursday evening's prayer meeting a course of connected studies in the life of Christ has been followed. The young people met on Tuesday evening, and for the first half of their meeting, follow the regular program outlined by the United Church. The other half of the meeting is taken up with a study in Teacher Training work. All ready one book has been about completed. One of the most interesting features in these meetings is a debate on Bible characters held once a month. The last was "Resolved that Elijah was a greater prophet than Elisha." In this debate the decision was given in favor of Elisha. The next debate is to be on May 4, and the subject chosen is "Resolved, that John was a greater apostle than Peter."

MAJORITY IS ON MEMORIAL TABLET

OTTAWA, April 27—A memorial tablet has been placed in the Dominion archives building, Ottawa, in tribute to the memory of 16 members of the Canadian Arctic expedition, 1913-18, who perished during the expedition in widely separated sections of the Arctic.

The tablet was prepared under the supervision of the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada.

In addition to the inscription, "In memory of those who perished, Canadian Arctic Expedition, 1913-18," the names are given in alphabetical order with the rank of each and an inscription at the foot

of the tablet: "For Canada, for Science—Pour La Patrie et Pour La Science."

Among those commemorated is Peter Bernard, master of the Mary Sachs, a native of Prince Edward Island, who lost his life, as did Charles Thompson, seaman, while crossing Banks Island in the winter of 1916-17.
