THE mail train arrived last night at 10.10.

MR J W CORORAN, the heavy weight partner of the Canada Printing Ink Co, was a passenger by the S S Campana yesterday. Mr Cororan is accompanied by his wife and family. They proceeded to Pictou.

THE pulpit of the Baptist church will be filled tomorrow morning and evening by Rev Malcolm A McLean, late of Rochester Seminary, and recently called to the pastorate of the North Sydney Baptist church.

MESSEURS J L Godkin and A Sabine leave this morning by carriage to drive to West Point and will spend Sunday in Summerside. Mrs Godkin and Mrs Sabine proceed by train and will be met at West Point by their husbands.

BEFORE Stipendiary Magistrate Blanchard, at Souris, on Wednesday evening M J Foley and Boniface McLellan, were each convicted of violating the Canada Temperance Act, and fined in the sum of \$50 and costs or two months imprisonment. A summons against James Moynagh was dismissed.

Twelve pupils from this school passed the entrance examination to Prince of Wales college, most of them making high, and all of them creditable marks. But this is only in keeping with the thorough work for which Principal Miller's apartment is noted.

A YOUNG man named Arthur Thompson, son of Mr Jas Thompson, while engaged in running Butler's Carding Mill, Sturgeon, on Thursday last, accidentally got his left hand caught in the cards and his whole arm was drawn in. The skin and flesh were torn to shreds and the arm was literally carded, but no bones were broken. Dr Robertson was immediately summoned and dressed the arm. The young man is now resting as comfortably as could be expected.—Patriot.

THE dwelling house of F L Haszard, Esq, on Easton and Olear streets, was damaged by fire yesterday morning. The fire, which is believed to have been caused by electric wires, started in the cellar near the verandah, and by the time the firemen arrived it was well under way in the partition leading to the upper part of the house. The firemen, who were on the scene with all possible alacrity extinguished the fire, not, however, before some damage was caused by water and the cutting of the walls to admit of getting at the seat of trouble. The house has been closed for several days past, Mr Haszard and family being at Bellevue. The damage caused by the fire is covered by insurance.
