## Ripper Maims Animals Defies Scotland Yard

LONDON, April 30.—The "Jack the Ripper" of the animal world is active again, and owners of horses, and cattle in the neighborhood of Stafford are filled with justifiable apprehension, according to a correspondent of The Cardiff Times and South Wales Weekly Review. Swiftly and silently, over a period now covering twenty years, this unseen terror of the night has ranged over the Stafford-Wolverhampton-Walsall area. His handiwork is found in the morning, when a dumb animal is found weltering in blood, shockingly maimed. More often than not a vague intimation of the coming outrage has been foreshadowed by an ill-spelt letter sent to the police or local persons or occasionally to the editor of a newspaper. Signed "G. H. Darby," or "Captain of the Wyley Gang," these communications have been the only view to the elusive creature who has been hunted by some of the cleverest detectives in Staffordshire and also by "Yard" men who were called in to solve the mystery.

One of the strangest features of these outrages is that the story begins with the trial and conviction of an educated man who was presumed to be the author of maiming of cattle in this district.

### Outrages Began in 1903

In 1903 Staffordshire was started by a series of inexplicable cattle maiming outrages. Obviously none but a disordered brain, or one liable to temporary fits of aberration could carry out such senseless crimes. Prior to these, there was a deluge of anonymous letters, addressed to public characters, and foreshadowing crimes of the night fields that did actually materialize. Eventually a young Birmingham solicitor was arrested. His name was George Edalji—a man of brilliant promise. It seemed impossible to believe he could be guilty, but upon strong circumstantial evidence he was convicted and sentenced to a term of penal servitude. The district afflicted by the Terror breathed again.

But suddenly the maiming commenced again and in a more frightful fashion. Horses—and generally valuable ones—left grazing in the fields at night were found in daylight cruelly slashed—bleeding, sometimes dying. At the same time another cloud of letters descended on various people. They were signed, and out of them grew the name of the Invisible Ripper—"Captain G. H. Darby."

Meanwhile Edalji languished in prison. He had always protested his innocence and many persons believed in it. An agitation resulted in his case being reviewed by the Home Office, and he was pardoned and set free.

Then came another virulent outbreak of letters, breathing forth threats and naming the area where an outrage would take place. In many instances despite active police watchers posted in the district, the "Shadow" carried out his mission of maiming, and some poor animal was found in the morning suffering from diabolical wounds.

### Ceased During War

Just before the war the maiming outrages reached a crescendo. During the war the outrages ceased and became at last nothing but a horrid memory. Once again the cattle and horses were left out at night. It can only be surmised that the "Captain" had "joined up" and

was happily transferred from the neighborhood. Then after the close of hostilities the maiming began again. Who is this criminal who has been hunted for over twenty years? Such men are often highly religious. It is significant that "Jack the Ripper" (who once conversed for some time with a woman who narrowly escaped being his victim) came to her in the inoffensive guise of a missionary with tracts. Quite possibly the maimer of animals may himself be unconscious of his exploits—a miserable "Jekyll" of respectability at times dominated by the murderous "Hyde" of the night. In 1864 there was a similar outbreak in the midlands, and in 1880 a greater part of Devon and Cornwall was terrorized by an unknown maimer, who attacked cattle only. No arrests were ever made in either of these cases.
