LORD BROOKE'S SERVICES APPRECIATED

OTTAWA, July 16.—In the office of the Minister of Militia and Defence yesterday, morning Lord Brooke, who commanded the camp at Petewawa, was the recipient of a pearl pin, presented to him by Colonel Hughes as a personal gift from the Minister, to show his appreciation of the manner in which Lord Brooke performed his duties at the camp. Col. Hughes stated that Lord Brooke had performed a difficult task with a great amount of tact and he was assured of the goodwill of every officer and soldier in Petewawa. Col. Hughes also sent via Lord Brooke, a pearl pendant for Lady Brooke, and a pearl pin for Lieut-Colonel Earl, who acted as chief staff officer for Lord Brooke. Accompanied by Count Berthier Desauvigny, of Washington, who is an old friend, Lord Brooke left for Quebec yesterday afternoon to sail by the Canadian today.

LORDS REJECT THE PLURAL VOTING BILL

LONDON, July 16.—The House of Lords yesterday rejected by 119 votes to 49 the Plural Voting Bill which embodies the principle of "one man one vote" and provides that a man who has more than one residence must before an election, select which of his votes he desires to register. Earl Beauchamp, on behalf of the Government, intimated that the defeat of the measure was purely academic, as the Government intended to see that it went into operation before the next general election. The Bill already has passed twice through all its stages in the House of Commons.

WINSTON CHURCHILL RECEIVED U. S. CADETS.

LONDON, July 16.—Winston Churchill, First Lord of the British Admiralty, held a reception in the House of Commons yesterday for a contingent of midshipmen from the U. S. battleship Missouri. He conversed with them for a long time, showing great interest in American methods of training and life afloat and in return he told his young visitors all they wanted to know about British naval cadets.
