Charge Tito With Using U. S. Mules For Army Purposes

By ALEX H. SINGLETON WASHINGTON, Oct. 5 (AP)—P. H. La Guardia, renowned as a big city mayor but not on such solid ground as a naturalist, had a ready explanation today of charges that Yugoslavia has been using U. N. R. R. A. mules for its army.

The U. N. R. R. A. director-general, former mayor of New York, delivered to a press conference this theory as to how the charges arose: The American army presented some mules to the Yugoslav army some months ago. The U. N. R. R. A. sent other mules there for relief and rehabilitation work. Time passed and the Yugoslavs did a little mule-swapping among themselves for breeding purposes, Mr. La Guardia said.

Accuses United States And Britain Of Violating Treaty

(By Louis Nevins) PARIS, Oct. 5 (AP)—Soviet delegate A. A. Arutunian, angered by a peace conference proposal to put a watchdog over Italian reparations, today accused the United States and Britain of violating their four-power agreements.

The exchanges took place in the major issue to be disposed of in commissions before tomorrow night's deadline. Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov of Russia left for Moscow by plane to confer with Prime Minister Stalin. A Russian embassy spokesman said he was expected to return by Monday, when the plenary session of the conference will meet to take final action on the peace treaties before the Oct. 15 adjournment date.

The Soviet charge against Britain and the United States was made at a morning meeting of the Italian economic commission, and this afternoon a British proposal on reparations grants touched off new fireworks. British delegate W. Glenvil Hall proposed that Italy provide £25,000,000, Yugoslavia and Greece \$100,000,000 each and that Albania, which requested \$1,161,000,000 receive nothing.

The charge of violating the big four agreement was made by Mr. Arutunian as the Italian economic commission adopted 12 to 8 an Australian proposal for establishing an international commission to supervise all economic clauses in the Italian treaty. Mr. Arutunian declared that the United States and Britain had violated an agreed section of the Foreign Ministers' treaty draft dealing with reparations. He apparently referred to article 64, which deals with reparations to Russia and provides that other claims should be taken up at the peace conference.

Up until now she has been jumping from platforms at least 20-25 feet in height. Most of her 'flying' has been done at night because she is shy of publicity.

KALGOORLIE PIPES WATER 350 MILES KALGOORLIE, Australia, Oct. 4 (CP)—This West Australia city of 12,000 inhabitants, built around the richest goldfield in Australia, has its water supply pumped through a pipeline 350 miles long from the Mundaring Reservoir near Perth, west of Kalgoorlie.

LONDON (CP)—The Earl of Athlone has resigned as colonel of the 7th Queen's Own Hussars. entirely upon the pipeline for water. It is just on the fringe of some of the most arid desert areas in Australia, and natural water sources are negligible. Rainfall averages only 10 inches a year, and there are no rivers from which the city could draw water.
