Last night there left for a tour of the Maritime Provinces a hockey team which has been something of a dark horse in the sporting realm of this city, for its organization was not known to many. It is called the Charlottetown Hockey Club and numbers some well known Island players who have played star parts in games of former years. Among the forwards is Charles McQuillan who played formerly with the Victorias. S., if available will be taken on and the team made up as thought most suitable. The team expect to meet Westville or Stellarton tonight, play two games with Sydney, one at North Sydney and one at Glace Bay and get on as many more games as possible in the course of a few weeks. P. C. Brown is Sec'y of the Club and accompanies the team. A. S. Hewitt is President of the association and Dr. Strickland, Vice President. As Secretary of the Prince Edward Island Hockey League I wish to notify you that those men do not represent any club in the League or in the Province, but are composed of a gang of players going away for a time to try and make money, purely professional hockey as far as they are concerned, I am sending this to warn you. Kindly notify the Glace Bay Hockey Club, and Victorias of North Sydney, N. S. (Signed) H. S. McLeod, Secretary P. E. I. League. L. B. McMillan, also sent a telegram in his capacity as Vice-President of the M. P. A. A., somewhat similar in effect to the above. However, the members of the club last night before leaving on their tour notified Mr. McMillan that they had organized and thus complied with the requirements of the M. P. A. A. A. regarding notification of new clubs. In this way Mr. McMillan was officially notified of their existence and he sent another telegram to the effect that the organization was regularly organized and eligible to play.
