Mussolini Target of Senate Abuse; Butler Defended

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—Premier Mussolini of Italy was denounced in the Senate today by Senator Thomas Hefflin, Dem., Ala., as a "mad monarch" and "red handed tyrant," at whose order 137 Italians had been murdered in a single night.

Protests Apology

"I can't understand why we should apologize to Mussolini," Senator Hefflin said. "I would investigate the facts before subjecting this great general to humiliation."

Old-Age Pensions Cost \$11,000,000 Last Year

OTTAWA, Feb. 2.—Old-age pensions in Canada last year cost roughly \$11,000,000, according to latest statistics. The Dominion Government paid half. Quebec and the Maritime Provinces are not included.
