PARTY TERMS OF POWER.

In the thirty-eight years since the Dominion was founded our two great political parties have had various terms of power in the Dominion, and in the various Provinces. At the outset the federal Government was a composite one, made up of a combination of Conservatives and Liberals of the old school in somewhat equal proportions. But these party names then meant something different in each Province, and the formation of parties as they now exist was a gradual process. From 1867 to 1873 the federal Opposition was Liberal in name and the party in power called itself Liberal Conservative. It was, however, treated by the Opposition as wholly Conservative, and gradually the name Liberal-Conservative has passed out of use.

For the purpose of clearness we may use the common parlance of the day and speak of the Liberal and Conservative parties. In this view of the case there was first a Conservative term of power from 1867 to 1873, then a Liberal term till 1878, followed by a Conservative term till 1886, since which date the Liberal term has been continuous and is still going on. In the 38 years the Conservative terms added together make about 24 years and the Liberal terms about 14 years.

Ontario began with a short Conservative term of four years, followed by a Liberal term of 31 years and this by a Conservative term of one year still going on. The division of time between parties has been five years Conservative and 33 years Liberal.

Quebec has had more frequent alternations. Each party has had three terms, beginning with the Conservative, and ending with a Liberal term still going on. The time has been divided 25 years Conservative and 13 years Liberal.

Nova Scotia began with a brief Conservative term followed by a Liberal term of eight years, then a Conservative term of seven years since which time the Liberal party has held sway. The time as divided between parties has been eight years of Conservative and 30 years of Liberal rule.

New Brunswick and British Columbia can hardly be said to have had party government in the sense that other Provinces have had it. In New Brunswick the provincial Government has been a composite affair in which the Conservative element was dominant until the advent of Mr. Blair to power in 1883, and since the Liberal element has been more prominent. In British Columbia there has been little of party lines in provincial affairs, but the Conservative element has preponderated.

Manitoba began its career as a Province under Conservative auspices, and continued thus till 1888, and has been Conservative since 1900. The terms of power aggregate 23 years Conservative and 12 years Liberal.

Prince Edward Island has been 32 years in the Confederation, beginning under Conservative and ending under Liberal rule. The sum of the two Conservative terms has been 15 years and of the two Liberal terms 17 years.

The two new Provinces in the west bid fair both to start under Liberal rule as Alberta has already done. Leaving British Columbia out of account and rating the New Brunswick Government as now nominally Liberal we have the following as the political complexion of the country as indicated by the party Governments in power:

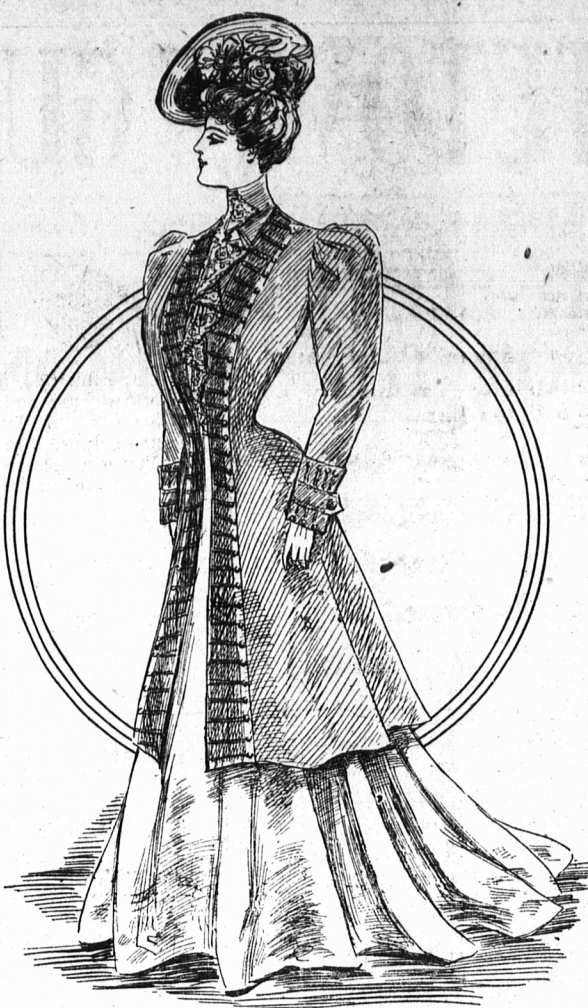
Beyond question the enactment of a Prohibitory Law by the Liberal party five years ago and the disposition since shown to provide for its enforcement has been a distinct source of strength to that party in Prince Edward Island.

According to the Moncton Transcript there has been an increase since 1896 of engine drivers and firemen on the Intercolonial as follows: Drivers increased from 125 to 361 and firemen increased from 175 to 402. The recent reductions are but a mere fraction of the increases. The Transcript tells that the highest wages of drivers total \$150 per month and the wages of firemen average about \$75. These are by no means starvation wages.

WITH DISTINCTLY PARISIAN TOUCHES.

The vogue of the two-piece costume, coat and skirt, still maintains, although the separate wrap has encroached somewhat upon its domain. The illustration shows its distinctively Parisian touches in the cut and the manner that the trimming is applied. The coat is of three-quarter length, a comfortable one for winter wear, and follows the lines of the figure closely, with the straight front line considerably emphasized. The material is a satin-face broadcloth, of a medium green in coloring, and the fronts are thrown back in reverses and trimmed with black velvet ribbon strap-pings, each strap held with a fancy button. The sleeve is a plain tailored design, with just a trifle more of fullness at the top than usual with a plain pattern; while the cuff is elaborated with strap-pings. The vest, with this season's characteristic high collar, is of white satin, cascaded all down the front with a princess jabot. The skirt is of extreme circular cut, interlined with a princess haircloth for several inches above the hem, falling in fluted folds to a full 10 yards wide at the hem.

Concessions are being made by wholesale by the Czar, the latest being a remission of \$800,000,000 due by the peasants on their land. This lessens the Russian revenue by \$35,000,000, the amount heretofore contributed by the peasants as land dues or redemption dues, as they were called, which in view of the poverty of the peasantry constituted an intolerable burden. Doubt is expressed as to whether the peasants will be satisfied with this very large concession, as the land will not yet be allotted to them free as they demand.

The re-election of Hon. James Cumiskey, Commissioner of Public Works by a majority of 75 votes was much in accordance with the general expectation. The day was fine and mild and as it is a time of general leisure everything was favorable to a large turnout of the free and independent, but the vote showed a considerable falling off from the figures of the general election. The general belief that the result was a foregone conclusion, and that the Government stood to win at a by-election probably contributed to keeping a good many electors at home.

There were 224 deaths in Prince Edward Island from consumption in the last census year, as against 9,700 in the Dominion. In proportion to population the number of deaths from this dread disease ought not to have exceeded 194. The excess of 30 over the average shows that consumption is relatively more prevalent here than in the other Provinces. Dr. Moore tells that already by the means in use the death rate from consumption has been reduced 60 per cent in England. No doubt this improvement can be much further extended. But if only 60 per cent can be saved from our present consumption fatalities it would mean the saving of 134 lives yearly. Surely this is worth working for.

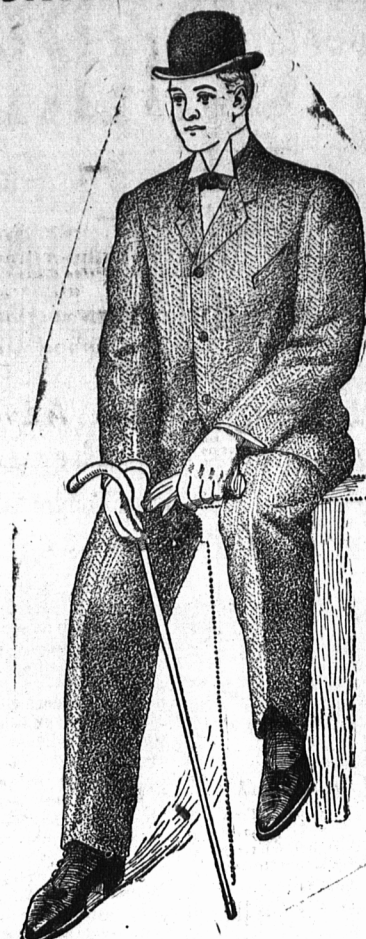
