TO PROVIDE MORE COMFORT FOR EMPLOYEES

OTTAWA, Nov. 26.—The award of the Lemieux act board in the case of the locomotive engineers of the Canadian Northern Railway Company establishes an important precedent, in that it stipulates that a railway company must provide adequate stopping places for engineers.

It was found by the board that "no sufficient provision had been made at points where the engineers are frequently forced to remain over night and some times after a long trip in most inclement weather," and as a result instructions were issued by the company to its superintendents by which the companies would "make such provision as such terminal points, where none are now provided, and better the conditions at other well known points."

REMINISCENCES OF THIS PROVINCE

Given by a Former Lady Resident Before a Women's Club in Boston on Her Return From a Visit to Her Old Home.

BOSTON, Nov. 28.—The following account of a trip by Mrs. Jessie G. Higgins, who conducts one of the leading ladies' costumes establishments in this city, will be read with interest by many Prince Edward Islanders.
