NEW YORK-BERMUDA TEST FLIGHTS MADE

FLYING BOATS SUCCESSFULLY SPAN ROUTE

Imperial And Pan-American Airways May Inaugurate Regular Service Next Month.

PORT WASHINGTON, N.Y., May 25.—(AP)—Two big flying boats, which probably will inaugurate regular passenger service between New York and Bermuda next month, lazed over the 783 miles of open ocean today in what was described officially as survey flights. Off the record, the crews regarded the trip as something akin to a holiday.

From Manhasset Bay, an indentation on the north shore of Long Island, a Pan American Airways plane of 21 tons picked up a tail wind the moment it lifted off the waters in brilliant sunlight and drifted into the harbor at Hamilton, Bermuda, four hours and 54 minutes later.

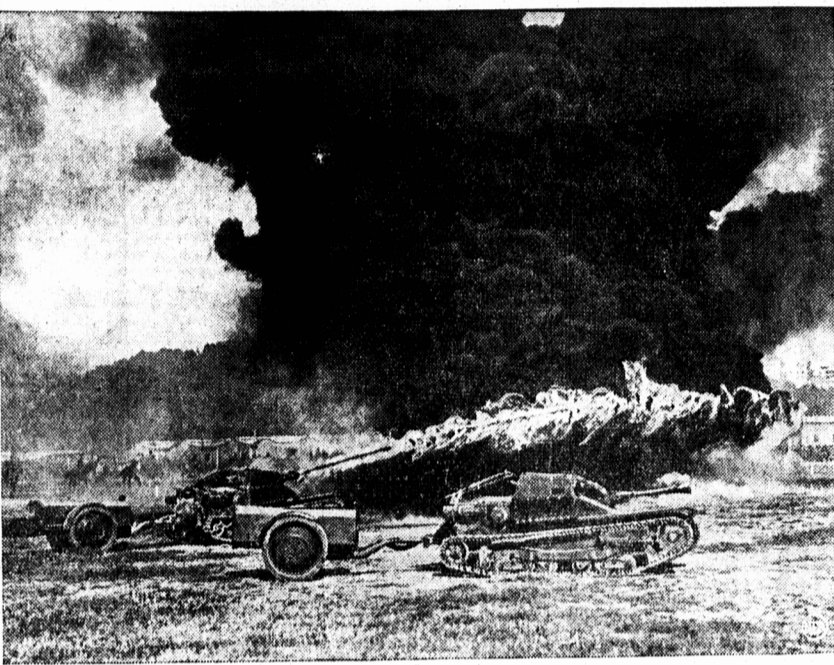

Inquest Into Death Of John C. Francis Today.

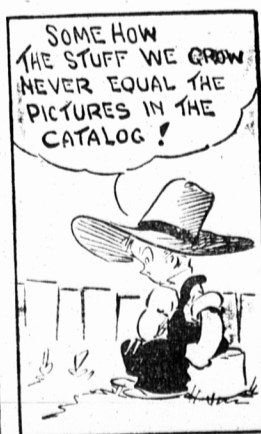
Investigation into the circumstances surrounding the death of 55-year-old John Charles Francis of Scotchfort was continued by Mounted Police yesterday.
