There was some months ago a report that Mr. Corby, member for West Hastings, would resign his seat to make place for Hon. Mr. Foster. Mr. Corby has gone south on account of failing health, and in passing through Toronto said he was quite ready to resign if he thought the Government would bring on the election promptly, but if he did resign it would not be in favor of Mr. Foster, nor would the latter be likely to secure a nomination there as his name had not been mentioned. Moreover West Hastings had never had an outside representative and was not likely to want one now.

The St. John Telegraph as now a new editor in the person of Mr. H. F. Gadsby, who comes from Toronto, and has won some distinction as a parliamentary correspondent and magazine writer. He is the fourth to succeed to the position within about seven years past. Hitherto many newspaper men have gone from Eastern Canada to the Western Provinces and have succeeded in most instances very well. This has not been true of those who have come from the West to the East. We see no sufficient reason, however why Mr. Gadsby may not prove a brilliant and first exception to the rule.

The writ for a new election in East Queen's has been promptly issued and the election will be speedily held. Nomination is fixed for 13th March and polling one week later. Mr. McKinnon will again be the Liberal candidate and has announced a series of meetings, notices of which appear in another column of this issue. We presume that Mr. Martin will again be the conservative Candidate, but have as yet no positive information. We trust that this time in the best interest, of all concerned that the election law may be scrupulously observed.

A correspondent calls attention to a method of permanently marking the names of streets which has been adopted in cities of the United States within the past few years. The names are set in blocks of stone or cast iron and the blocks themselves set in the outer corners of the side walks flush with the surface. There are two objections to this method, the first cost and the fact that in the winter season the marks would be frequently covered with snow or ice.

Mr. Bourassa, who so strongly opposed the sending of Canadian soldiers to South Africa, has given notice of a motion to stop recruiting for the South African Police in Canada, and declaring that peace ought to be promptly made on a basis of independence for the South African Republics. Mr. Bourassa may be personally tolerated in the House of Commons, but will receive but very small support for his motion. He is apparently seeking a cheap and nasty notoriety.

Mr. Costigan's motion as amended in regard to changing the coronation oath so as to eliminate the objectionable phraseology, passed the House of Commons on Friday evening by a large majority—125 to 19. This is only an expression of Canadian opinion, however; and it is only the British Parliament which can make the change that is sought for.

LONDON, February 23.—The house of commons to-day after a lengthy debate passed the second reading of the bill restricting the work of miners to eight hours daily by 212 to 190 votes.
