CANADIAN WEST RICH IN OIL.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 25.—Cunningham Craig, former geological surveyor of Great Britain, and of Trinidad, and consulting geologist to the Burmah Oil Company and the British Government, arrived in Winnipeg this morning enroute to Calgary and adjacent territory, where he is about to conduct a rigid survey of the oil lands to the southwest of that city.

Speaking of the possibilities of the territory over which the expert has already been, Mr. Craig stated today that the possibilities were tremendous. The navy royal commission on fuel and engines had called him before them in London to give evidence on our possibilities of Western Canada in oil, if the product was as great as Mr. Craig expected it would mean that naval eyes would be turned direct to the west as a source of fuel for the British navy, a matter which was now being given the most serious consideration.

Mr. Craig leaves tonight with Mowbray S. Berkeley, for Calgary, where he will make final geological surveys and first test wells before finally passing his definite opinion. A note of warning regarding rash speculation was issued by Mr. Craig, who pointed out that the petroliferous lands that are southwest of Calgary, while being rich in oil, could be next to a strip which would bear no oil at all.

THIRTY MILLION DOLLARS FOR ST. JOHN.

OTTAWA, Oct. 26.—The Public Works Department will call for tenders in a few days for the construction of two new million dollar concrete piers at Victoria, B. C. The new piers at Victoria will be constructed in the outer harbor within a shielding breakwater, and the work as now planned, aggregating a total expenditure of over \$5,000,000, will provide for the growing shipping of the port for years to come.

Millions are being spent also on Vancouver harbor, besides some \$700,000 on the dredging of False Creek within the harbor. At Esquimalt also the Government proposes building a huge dry dock 1150 feet long, similar to that at Lewis, for which the Prime Minister last Friday turned the first sod.

Other immense Federal expenditures on ports include the Toronto harbor improvements, costing five millions, and the contracts recently awarded for three sections of the new Welland Canal. These latter total about \$19,000,000 or a third of the total cost of the canal.

IN THE GRASP OF A WHIRLPOOL.

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., October 24.—Over four hours in the grasp of the whirlpool in a small motor boat, rescued at eight o'clock last night, Peter W. Langaard, of Dare, was more dead than alive. He was taken to a hotel on the Canadian side, where it was said he would be all right in twenty-four hours, although his nerves were badly shattered by the ordeal through which he passed.

Langaard made the trip through the Whirlpool rapids from the Maid of the Mist's Landing, on the Canadian side of the whirlpool, to furnish a subject for a moving picture film. The trip had been made several times before without mishap.

Langaard navigated the rapids safely, but when he swung into the whirlpool, driftwood clogged the propeller of his boat and he was powerless to bring the craft out of the centre of the vortex.

For nearly three hours he endeavored to clear the propeller by leaning over the stern of the boat, but the driftwood was so tightly jammed between the flanges and the hull that he could not remove it and the carening of the boat when it was sucked into the very centre of the whirlpool made it necessary for him to devote nearly all his efforts to keep it from overturning.

Shortly before eight o'clock Fred Preston, of Niagara Falls, Ont., volunteered to swim out with a life line attached to his wrist. Langaard by this time was exhausted and lay still in the bottom of the boat, which bobbed around in the vortex like a cork.

Aided by instructions called out by Preston, the boat was finally manoeuvred out of the danger zone, and was slowly drawn ashore. Preston was given a great ovation by the crowd.

VICTIM OF OTTAWA MURDER CAME TO DEATH BY VIOLENCE.

OTTAWA, Oct. 24.—That Abraham Rubenstein came to his death by violence, consisting of a blow on the head followed by strangulation by a person or persons unknown to the jury.

The above verdict was returned tonight at the adjourned inquiry into the death of Abe Rubenstein, of Brooklyn, N. Y., the bookmaker's clerk, whose body was found in a vacant shop on Somerset street, following the fall meeting at Connaught Park. But little new evidence was produced at the concluding session of the inquest to-night. A witness swore that he saw two negroes carrying a trunk along Somerset street, and identified a photo of a negro named Slinn as one of the men. Slinn's whereabouts are at present unknown.

legal choice for the presidency to succeed General Victoriano Huerta.

No official announcement was made to-night, but it was unofficially estimated, judging from the results in the capital, where it was expected the vote would be up to the average, that less than 10,000 of the 80,000 eligible voters in the republic went to the polls. It would be no surprise if congress, the members of which also were voted for to-day, declared the elections void when that body is organized and revises the returns.

The leaders of the Catholic party claimed a long lead, although they were unable to estimate the number of votes polled for their candidates, Federico Gamboa and General Rascón. If this claim is correct it is generally thought that General Felix Diaz and General Roquena ran second. The liberal candidates, Manuel Calero and Flores Magon, had no printed ticket at their polling places, their constituents being obliged to write their names in blank ballots.

President Huerta did not vote. He spent the day at his Popotla suburban home.
