The Associated Press was informed today that inquiries are being received by Irish land agents from wealthy Irishmen now residing in the United States regarding the possible purchases of estates in Ireland. Many of the landed gentry left Ireland during last year, anticipating a return to normal conditions, are said to desire to return to the land of their birth.

One of the narrowest majorities in favor of ratification of the Irish treaty was recorded on Saturday by the Cork County Council, when 15 voted 14, at a meeting specially summoned by the Lord Mayor.

After a ratification resolution was carried by the Donegal County Council, one of the members, Mr. Duffy formally presented his resignation, saying that he was unable to accept the treaty, not realizing that a great majority of his constituents desired ratification.

The Cavan County Council and the Tipperary Urban Council were among many other bodies adopting resolutions in favor of ratification.

Owing to the uncertainty of the future, recruiting has been suspended temporarily by all Irish infantry regiments, except the Irish Guards.

**Bodies Piled High Awaiting Burial**

MOSCOW, Jan. 9.—Russia has been the year 1922 with eight months of unrelenting horror, hunger and the terrible dread that next summer's crop may only slightly relieve the gnawing famine.

At Taratun, Saratov, Samara, Ufa, Orenburg and Kazan frozen bodies are stacked high awaiting burial in trenches which workmen cannot prepare fast enough for the victims of famine, exposure and typhus and every day the situation is growing worse.

American relief workers, who originally cautiously placed the number of probable deaths in the famine area this winter at 2,000,000, now say that 10,000,000 or even more, may be swat-

**Mail Gathering to Settle Fate of Irish Nation**

DUBLIN, Jan. 7.—The members of the Dail Eireann who have been spending the holidays at their homes are beginning to return to Dublin for the resumption of the sessions of the Dail on Tuesday.

During the past week Irish public opinion seemingly has consolidated in favor of the peace treaty with Great Britain, and the supporters of the treaty in the Dail today expressed for more confidence a ratification of the document than at any time since the debate opened. Their most conservative estimates are for a majority of about 12, and in a striking figure they declare that they leave out of consideration the possibility of a considerable number of the opponents of the treaty abstaining from voting. Estimates of the sentiment of the people throughout the country on the issue vary from 75 to 95 per cent. in favor of the treaty.

At a meeting of the Irish Commercial Travellers' Federation at Manly House on Saturday night, President Holland said with regard to the sentiment of the country on the question: "There is nobody in Ireland who knows the pulse of the country better than the commercial traveller, and therefore I can state that 95 per cent. of the people are in favor of the treaty."

One of all the local hearts throughout the south and west of Ireland which have expressed themselves with regard to the treaty, the Dail board of guardians still stands alone as opposed to its acceptance.
