CAPT. BERNIER'S WORK.

Captain Bernier appears in a way to have accomplished more than Peary in his latest polar trip. Peary got nearer to the pole than any previous explorer had done. Bernier formally took possession of fourteen islands in the name of Canada, and hoisted the national flag thereupon. Four or five of them are of considerable size and the remainder are small. They lie mainly between Baffin Land and Beaufort Sea. They are all practically uninhabitable for white people. Still it would have been very awkward if our American neighbors, whose whalers ply their calling in those far northern waters had taken possession before Canada and had obtained a territorial footing there, hemming us in as they have done on the Pacific coast by the purchase of Alaska. Had they done so all sorts of international questions would have arisen. Capt. Bernier has done good work for Canada, and we would have been glad if he could have been assisted in his plan to reach the pole. Some way it seems that the first man to reach the pole ought to be a Canadian.

HONEST AND NON-PARTISAN.

We regret the tone of The Patriot's article of yesterday under the caption, "Infatigable," because it needlessly implies that the movement for electoral reform is in some way aimed at the party in power. The great impediment to reform is that each party claims that the other is worse, and offsets or excuses its own wrong-doing by alleged greater wrong-doing on the other side. It is notorious that both parties have been guilty of corrupt practices. It is equally well known that the better elements of both parties are earnestly desirous to work together and bring about better conditions. There is nothing partisan about the Electoral Reform Association. Men of both parties are in it working together with mutual respect and confidence in each other, and with an earnest desire for the public welfare. This work is honest and it is non-partisan.

Senator Ferguson on Wednesday brought up in the Senate the wreck of the Sovinto coupled with some reflections upon the conduct of the federal officials here. Senator Scott characterized their conduct as "reprehensible" and promised that it shall be "looked into". Senator Robertson insisted on an investigation in the action of the Marine Agent here. We believe that both the officials concerned profess an entire willingness to have the matter investigated, and it is to be hoped that this may be done.

The Summerside Journal affirms "for the information of The Guardian" that smelts are shipped from Prince Edward Island to New York via Montreal. Our statement was that Mr. Henderson, Agent of the Canadian Express Company here, is not aware of any smelts being sent around by Montreal, and that all shipments made from Charlottetown to Boston go by the direct route. Mr. Henderson adheres to this statement.

ADULTERATED DRUGS.

Sir.—Away up here in the wild and woolly West we are not looking for fame in P. E. I. Before and after, "here" or "her" or "any other time—well (not at the present time at any rate. We are not much concerned about noxious weeds (let them grow—they had lots of chances this year for the grub wasn't in at all) and even the subject of Pure Elections call up but a faint interest, in comparison with the question uppermost in the thoughts of the people of this community namely, pure drugs.

NoV, Mr. Editor, if you can answer the following questions you will greatly oblige some of your western readers: Query No. 1. What quantity of glycerine, etc. can a druggist legally put in a bottle of whiskey to make a cough mixture?

Number two. How long before any symptoms of influenza or cold appear should the patient take the aforesaid mixture?

Number three. In what drug-stores have the people of O'Leary, Coleman and West Devon been getting this cough mixture lately—Summerside or O'Leary or from both places?

We are especially anxious to have this question answered because of the very severe effects arising from the use of impure drugs given by some druggists to a number of persons in the districts mentioned. Among the sober right-thinking who read some of your western readers: Query No. 4. What quantity of glycerine, etc. can a druggist legally put in a bottle of whiskey to make a cough mixture? In the face of all the revelations of adulterations made public this year will so adulterate their drugs that they are ashamed to acknowledge, or to allow their patients to tell where the drugs were procured. In the case of the wives and mothers of these patients the words "Who hath woe? Who hath sorrow? Who hath weep? Who hath babbled? Who hath contentions? Who hath wounds without cause? Who hath redness of eyes?" has been ably answered by the patients themselves.

Last query: How much can a doctor legally charge for a prescription for this cough mixture? A some of the patients who used this medicine are in poor circumstances a ten-cent or free prescription might help considerably in obtaining the desired drug.

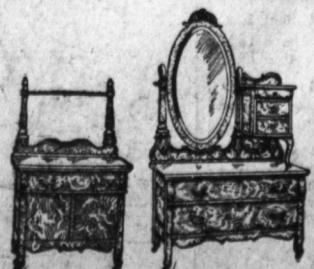
