...BRUSSELS, July 22 (Special)-Princesses Louise and Stephanie, daughters of the late King Leopold, after a long consultation with their Viennese and Belgian counsel, decided today to appeal to the Court of Cassation against the judgement of the Court of Appeals, which dismissed, on April 2, their claim to the entire Congo property left by their father, valued at \$14,000,000.

The Princesses had rejected a compromise proposed by the Minister of Justice.

...In an attempt to pass through the Manasquan River current into the ocean tides opposite Brielle, N. J., Thomas H. The point where the accident occurred has long been known as a dangerous passage. Several lives have been lost there, and experienced operators of motor boats seldom attempt to pass through it. According to fishermen who were nearby when Mr. Heyes was thrown into the water, the eddies yesterday seemed unusually quiet, and not until the boat was midway in the cross current did Mr. Heyes lose control.

Mr. Heyes was at his summer home at Brielle, with his wife and five children, representative medical men from various parts of the United States, who will attend the seventeenth International Congress of Medicine, to be held in London beginning August 6, arrived in Paris today.

Another feature of the review which made a great hit with the onlookers was a detachment of military ambulances dogs, which marched past in perfect order.

During the review five army aeroplanes darted here and there over the heads of the troops, while a military dirigible circled and manoeuvred.
