A WOMAN'S VIEW OF THE BAR

LONDON, Oct. 11, (Special)—"There is no reason why women should not be lawyers; it is an honest employment," said Miss McMillan at the annual conference of Women's Workers at Hull. She moved a resolution in favor of the admission of women to the legal profession. It would, she said, bring about reforms in much the same way as the admission of women to the medical profession brought about reforms. The United Kingdom ought not to lag so far behind the rest of the world.

Miss Agnes Garrett, who seconded the resolution, remarked that, as regards the legal profession being honest, she would prefer to say that it might be an honest profession. If women joined it there would be a chance of it becoming more honest than it was at present. The resolution was adopted unanimously.

CUBAN IS PRAISED FOR PROGRESS

NAPLES, Oct. 11, (Special)—Colonel Orestes Ferrara, formerly President of the Cuban House of Representatives, in a published interview says Cuba has made great progress since American intervention, becoming the most advanced among the Latin countries of the American continent. The same would happen in the case of Mexico, he declared, where President Wilson's wise policy would contribute to the settlement of the internal crisis.

CHASE ACROSS EUROPE. A MELODRAMA IN REAL LIFE.

It is not often, says the Paris correspondent of the Standard that a man who has determined to commit murder and suicide attempts, as his last chance, to carry out his intention in the presence of a Magistrate and the police. Yet the facts revealed at the inquiry into the circumstances attending the pistol firing inside the Clignancourt Police Station show that M. Paul Loos not only decided to kill the operatic singer Hersilia Capri, but had made arrangements that their bodies should be burned together. The whole story is fantastic, and stranger, indeed, than fiction.

Three years ago Hersilia, whose real name is quite different, stage-struck and sick to her humdrum life, left home, and the first town she came to being Angers, applied for an engagement to M. Paul Loos, the proprietor of "El Dorado" there. The writers of novels often make managers fall in love at first sight with charming debutantes, but, though such events are almost unknown in real life. Hersilia was given an engagement, and soon gained not only the favour of the public, but the heart of her manager. So infatuated was he that he sold his "El Dorado" and left wife, children, and home, and with six thousand pounds in his pocket brought Hersilia to Paris.

A RIOT OF PLEASURE.

What the couple's life was there has been told by Hersilia to the Paris Journalists, for the first few months there was a continuous riot of pleasure, but at the end of the year Hersilia got tired, and was seized with a fancy for travelling. She insisted on going alone to fulfil her engagements in foreign capitals, but Loos, being furiously jealous, was wont to follow her unawares and turn up suddenly in the most unexpected places.

The longest journeys and the greatest expense never daunted him, and after various times catching the girl up at Lyons, Cairo, and St. Petersburg, he appeared recently in Constantinople, where Hersilia was on tour. This time he found her engaged in flirting with a comic actor from the Montmartre, and threatened her with his vengeance.

The day after his arrival Hersilia took passage on a steamer to Marseilles, and believed that she had escaped, but when out at sea she discovered Loos on board. The man dogged her steps steadily back to Paris, and on Friday evening as Hersilia was getting into a taxi cab he suddenly jumped in, shut the door, and menaced her with a revolver. Half dead with fright, the girl promised anything and everything he wanted, and in order to prove her sincerity stripped herself of all her jewels and money and gave them to him as a sign of good faith.

REVOLVER IN HIS SOCK. In a very short while the detectives apprehended Loos on a charge of extortion and threats of murder, and in the afternoon he was confronted with Hersilia. Loos feigned contrition and surprise, asking how his "Little Doll" could think of having him, who loved her so dearly, arrested. She had no time to reply, however, as he stooped and from an unusual hiding place, his sock, drew a revolver. Before he could be prevented he fired four times point-blank at the girl, who, screaming, attempted to hide herself behind the police.
