In addition to the above mentioned arrests there were two prosecutions under the Prohibition Act with one conviction and one dismissal; four convictions under the Customs Act for harbouring smuggled liquor; one conviction for operating motor vehicle without license; one for driving motor vehicle to the common danger; one for disorderly conduct; four for non-payment of dog tax; seven for non-payment of transient labor tax, and one for selling gasoline at service station without license. There were six prosecutions for failing to render the Dominion Income Tax Return, resulting in five convictions and one dismissal, and two for common assault with one conviction and one dismissal. One charge of non-support was dismissed.

On December 22nd and 28th the Force collected forty samples of milk from licensed vendors, delivering same to the City Analyst for test. In connection with the milk test made in November, two of which contained sediment, the two offenders were prosecuted and each fined five dollars and costs.
