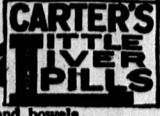
Cheese And Butter

The quality was well up to former years; a few cheese showing some marshy or salt marsh flavor which is not desired by the trade, and it should be impressed among Dairy Farmers the importance of keeping their cows away from anything that might prove injurious to the fine reputation of Island cheese.

It is regrettable that all the Cheese Factories do not compete in this competition, and receive the educational advantages to be derived therefrom.
The exhibit of Creamery Butter was larger than former years, and the quality was also somewhat better, and showed a very uniform high quality throughout, with one exception and the butter-maker there explains the reason as being that he ran out of ice. Schooner Race Again Postponed

HALIFAX, Oct. 11.—A marine picture of rare beauty was presented in Halifax harbor on Saturday when the nine schooners entered in the ocean race crossed the starting line just after noon and ghosted seawards with a speed that was surprising for the very light air then prevailing. There was no race the contest being called off three hours later when the vessels had covered about six and a half miles of the forty mile course, but Halifax saw a beautiful spectacle and the skippers and crews of the competing craft had some real sport. The race is scheduled to commence at nine o'clock Monday morning if there is sufficient wind.

From fifteen minutes before the start to an hour or afterwards the contest on Saturday was crowded with exciting incidents. Enough happened to furnish discussion and argument for weeks among the crews of the vessels and keep the local waterfront agog over the burning question as to "which boat had the best of it."

As it was, although the race was called off, some of the skippers made a race of it, six of the schooners rounding the inner automatic buoy, 6.4 miles from the starting line, before heading homewards, thus establishing a time test of their relative speed in the weather of the day. In this race honors undoubtedly went to the bowsprit schooner Delaware, Captain Thomas Himmelman, which rounded the mark five minutes ahead of the second vessel, the knockout schooner Gilbert B. Walters, Captain Angus Walters, though the latter gained somewhat on the run home. It was demonstrated on Saturday that, in very light and variable winds, there is not much to pick and choose between the two types, but the question is still open as to their respective merits in moderate and very weather.
