CHARLES LAMB AS AN ESSAYIST

The essay has been declared to be "the most artistic of all forms of non-creative literature." It has the element of reflection, and treats a single subject from a single point of view.

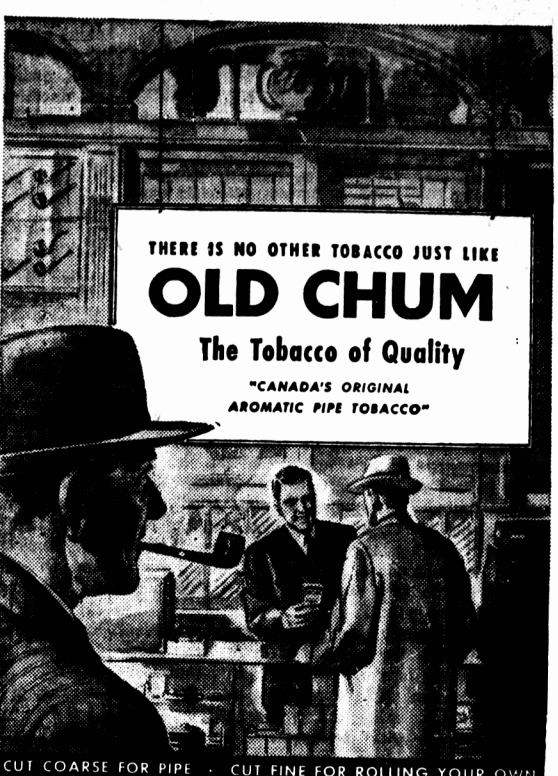
His wonderful devotion to his sister Mary is well known, and is one of the finest stories in all literature. Lamb fell in love with a girl whom he calls "Alice," but they did not marry—she later became the wife of one Bartram.

Lamb's essays are delightful and exceedingly human compositions, and one who is not familiar with them has missed much. A notable one is that called "The Supper of St. Shakespeare," which is really himself.

The essay entitled "My First Play" will appeal to many. He feels that he shall never again recall that "first, first, care-free rapture" with which he anticipated the event and enjoyed it.

The one called "Grace Before Meat" is a notable one. He says that he would like to have "twenty graces—one for Milton, one for Shakespeare, and one for zoning on a journey, or a pleasant walk or a friendly meeting. Grace, he said, was more fitting at the table of the poor. "Is it fitting" he asks to utter our praise with a mouth watering?

These are but glances at random at a book full of charm—reminiscent of what Ruskin said once. "I do not so much wonder at what men suffer as at what they miss."

Canadian Warships Sail From Balboa

BALBOA, Panama Canal Zone, Nov. 20 — (CP) — Two Canadian warships weighed anchor today and sailed for Acapulco, on the southern coast of Mexico, for rendezvous with a third Canadian ship.

They will rendezvous off Acapulco next Monday with the cruiser Uganda, will carry out three days of training exercises, then head in to port until Dec. 3. On Dec. 1 they take part in ceremonies marking the inauguration of the new Mexican president Miguel Aleman.

Every member of the crew who could remain on deck did so during the daylight to duck crossing. A 21-gun salute was exchanged between the ship and Fort Wade at the Atlantic end of the canal.
