DOUBLE DROWNING IN ST. LAWRENCE

BROCKVILLE, Ont., Dec. 22.—A double drowning occurred in the river at Ogdensburg, when Gordon Runion, 23; Kenneth Runion, 17, and Clara Runion, 11, broke through the ice.

The accident was due to the girl venturing on the thin ice and breaking through. Her cries attracted the attention of her brother Gordon who plunged into the water in a vain attempt to rescue her.

While the two brothers sought to regain the solid ice, Mashaw, in a leaky boat put out from the shore. With his hands he battered out a path for his craft, cutting his fingers severely in the opening.

KAISER WILLIAM IS IN THE LIME LIGHT.

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—A London cable to the Herald says: "The different descriptions that correspondents have given of the Kaiser have aroused an interest, one might almost say curiosity, in the present condition of the man who is said to have been seriously ill."

"He has been described as a broken old man. His hair has grown white with anxiety he has dyed it. He has been too agitated to dye it. Both versions are current. His aspect is haggard, almost maniacal, his eyes are those of an insomniac. A crowning touch: He is even reported to have shaved off his terrible moustaches.

"A very different Kaiser is pictured by German and Austrian-Italian writers. Baron von Skoda, a name made almost as famous as Krupp by the efficient Austrian motor howitzers, recently made a trip to the German headquarters and dined with the Emperor. He communicated his impression to the New Free Press of Vienna. He said he found the Kaiser in the best of health and looking extremely fit. The rumors of his ill health and of his hair having turned grey he dismissed as idle inventions."
