INTERCESSION AT ST. PAUL

LONDON, Aug. 22.—St. Paul's Cathedral, which is situated in the heart of London, was crowded all day and to-night by sorrowful worshippers, downcast because of the war. It is generally recognized as the nation's church and it was filled to its capacity by citizens begging intercession for soldiers and sailors who are engaged in the conflict. Services began at seven in the morning and continued throughout the day. Signs bearing the words "church full" were posted early. The gates of the church yard were closed, and thousands of people gathered in the street awaiting an opportunity to enter. Many soldiers uniform were among worshippers. Last night the Lord Mayor of London attended the services with a large detachment of soldiers.
