


**STRICKEN DUMB AT DAUGHTERS' FUNERAL**

KANSAS CITY, Dec. 9.—Physicians are taking great interest in the case of Andrew Hutchinson, who has been speechless since the funeral of his daughters, Ethel and Flossie, victims of a sand-cave-in on the Kaw River bank last Sunday. Mr. Hutchinson, who is sixty years old, was stricken dumb on his way to the funeral. His relatives thought it a symptom of his great grief, but yesterday he still was unable to speak and they became alarmed and summoned Dr. Z. Nason.

The physician attributed the affliction to a gunshot wound received during the Spanish-American war while serving in the United States Army. The physician says the injury was such as under certain stress would cause dumbness and other afflictions. Mr. Hutchinson is in a semicomatose condition, which marks similar cases, according to Dr. Nason.

"I cannot say whether he will be permanently speechless or not," the physician said. "His speech may return at any time, and again it may not. If he recovers his speech, he will be liable to such attacks later."

The stricken man is a well digger. He never has been subject to such attacks of any other chronic illness, members of his family say.

**MILK INSPECTION ACT**

(Continued From Page 5.)

8. No person shall by himself or his agents sell, expose or keep or offer for sale anywhere in this city:

(a) Milk adulterated with water or with any other substance.

(b) Milk containing less than 12 per cent of total solids, of which 3 1/2 per cent shall be butter fat.

(c) Unwholesome milk or milk that is fermented or that is tainted or impregnated with any germ of disease, odor or any foreign matter or thing whatever.

(d) Milk from a tuberculous cow, or cow otherwise diseased or emaciated or milk from a herd, any member of which is tuberculous, diseased or emaciated.

(e) Natural milk or milk from cows kept or milked under unclean and unsanitary conditions.

(f) Milk kept or contained or handled or sold in unclean vessels or from unclean vehicles, or milk handled by persons of unclean personal habits or by persons diseased.

9. Every person selling or delivering milk in the city from vehicles shall use for that purpose a properly covered wagon and shall always keep the same wholesome and clean.

10. Every person who is licensed or who applies for license to sell or deliver milk in the city shall on and after the passing of this By-law file with the City Clerk a statement disclosing the location and ownership of all the cows from which he directly or indirectly obtains or proposes to obtain the milk to be sold or delivered, and which said statement must show through what intermediaries the milk is proposed to be made by the Inspector, and shall pass, and he shall in like manner keep the City Clerk notified in writing of all changes in the source or handling of said milk.

11. It shall be the duty of all licensed Milk Vendors to see that the Inspector is permitted at all times to examine and inspect all milk sold, kept or offered for sale in the city, and all cows, stables, dairies, vessels, vehicles and other places within and without the city whence, where or in which milk to be sold or offered or kept for sale in the city is obtained, handled or kept.

12. Should at any time any person in control of any cows, stables, dairies, vessels or other places or things whence or where the said milk is obtained or kept refuse permission to the Inspector or other person acting in his behalf to inspect and examine any cow stables, dairies, premises or vessels then the license or licenses through which said milk is sold in the city shall be immediately cancelled.

13. No license shall be issued and if issued the license shall be immediately suspended in any case where the Inspector finds the herd or any member of the herd from which said milk is obtained to show visible symptoms of tuberculosis or any other disease or where the herd or any member thereof shall be emaciated or kept in unclean and unsanitary stables, premises, conditions or surroundings, or are handled or milked by diseased persons, or in an unclean and unsanitary manner, or where the milk is adulterated with water or other substance, or where the milk is kept or

MONTREAL, Dec. 11.—"If you ask me what it is that Scotland has given to the world, the most satisfactory answer that I can think of is 'Men'."

She has enriched the blood of humanity with a singularly virile, wholesome stock.
