WESTMORLAND W. I.

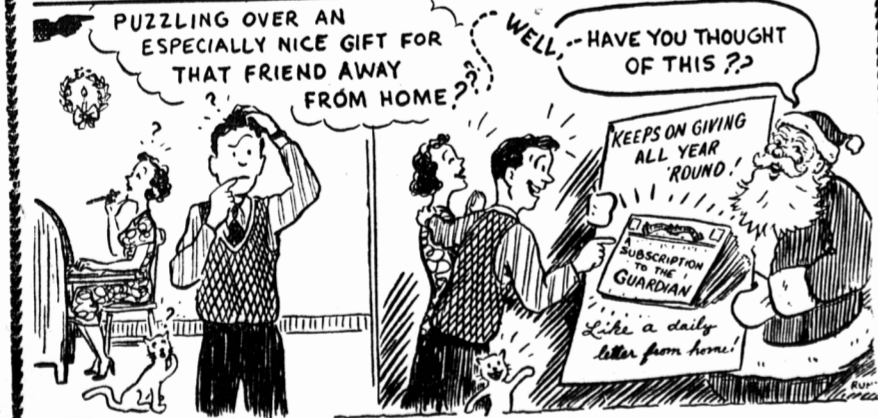

To Standardize War Equipment

LONDON, Dec. 19 — (AP) — Three powers which form the core of the Atlantic Pact announced an accord today on plans for eventually standardizing their military machines and training.
 The three countries — Canada, Britain and the United States — possess most of the military productive resources of the non-Communist world. Officials said the decision to go ahead with a program of dovetailing their arms, equipment and training marks the Atlantic Pact's greatest practical step forward.
 Study of the problem has been in progress since 1947. The field of agreement covers not only development of common designs and standards for weapons and equipment but also standardization of production, plant, machine tools, and technique.

U. S. Crop Report

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 — (AP) — The Agriculture Department, in its final report of the year, today estimated this year's wheat crop at 1,148,483,000 bushels and the corn crop at 3,377,790,000 bushels. The corn figure is 20,172,000 bushels more than the 3,357,618,000 forecast a month ago. It compares with last year's revised estimate of 3,861,793,000 bushels and with the 10-year (1938-47) average of 2,787,628,000. The wheat estimate is 20,237,000 bushels more from the 1,126,226,000 forecast a month ago. It compares with last year's revised estimate of 1,313,534,000 and with the 10-year average of 991,950,000.

LIFE INSURANCE COMPANIES PAY MILLIONS IN DEATH CLAIMS

TORONTO, Dec. 20 — Canadian families were paid more than \$164,937,000 by the 50-odd British, United States and Canadian life insurance companies in the first nine months of the year, a report by the Canadian Life Insurance Officers Association indicates.
 Analyzing death claims by province, the Association's report said that in Prince Edward Island \$255,419 was paid on 119 ordinary policies; and \$20,090 on 5 group certificates. Total death claim payments in Prince Edward Island were \$275,509 on 124 policies. The average death claim in Prince Edward Island was approximately \$2,220 compared to the national average of about \$1,200.

Rates For Collision Insurance Advance

TORONTO, Dec. 18 — (CP) — Rates for collision insurance on private automobiles are to be increased as much as 35 per cent in some categories on Jan. 1, the Canadian Underwriters Association and the Independent Automobile and Casualty Insurance Conference announced jointly Saturday. The statement blamed the increase on the rising number of accidents.

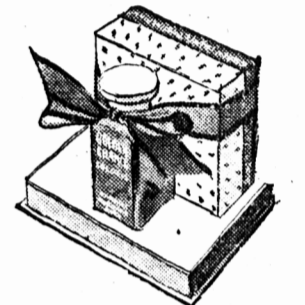

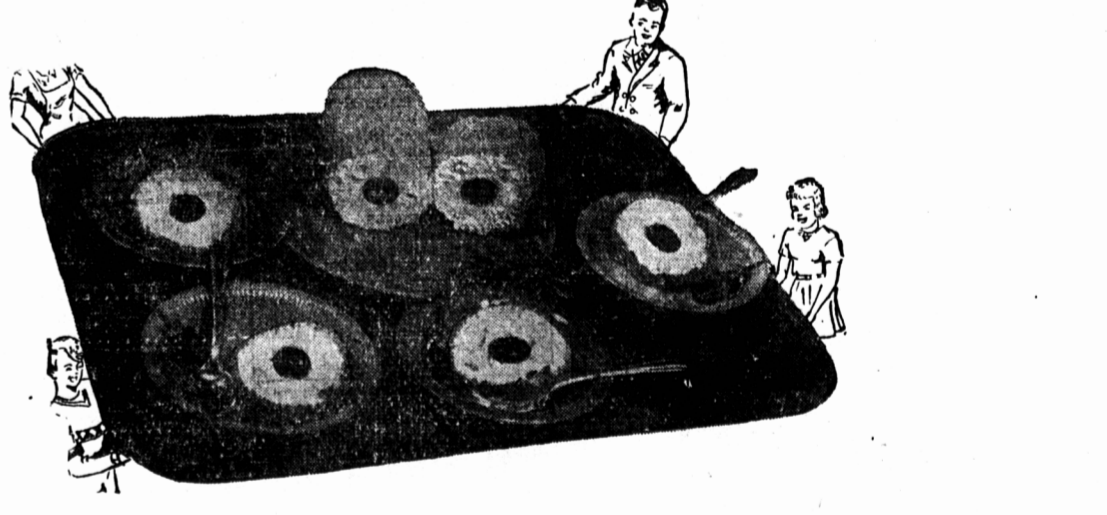
