REFORM PROMISED NOT YET DEFINITE

Russian Ministers' Forced to Make Public the Result of Their Deliberations—Bottle Shaped Bomb For Russian Prince—Six Thousand Attended Anti-Russian Meeting in Paris.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 7.—The following statement has been issued.

"The conference of the committee of Ministers on the reform proposed in the Imperial Decree of December 23 was concluded on Jan. 9 and the order in which the proposed reforms shall be carried out was announced on Jan. 10.

"The committee considered it necessary to consider each measure separately, and it was subsequently proposed the individual Ministers should draw up plans for the execution of reforms affecting their respective departments, or that special conferences be attended by delegates of institutions interested and by local representatives should be held under the presidency of the Emperor.

"The committee further deemed it necessary to request the Emperor to submit certain questions, which may be decided through legislative channels and the committee resolved to hold a provisional discussion which would serve to bring harmony out of different views prevailing with regard to the chief points of various questions. The Council of State, however, will retain full power to veto the final decision.

"Having agreed upon these methods of discussion, the committee concluded that it would be advisable to ascertain the views of the chiefs of the different Government departments and other non-ministerials.

"It was also resolved that an Imperial Ukase should be drawn up in the briefest terms possible and the steps assuring the realization of the reform schemes should be taken. The committee is of the opinion that success will be rendered surer by the publication of its decisions, which will be confirmed by the Emperor. The decisions already taken were sanctioned His Majesty on Jan. 22."

Paris, Jan. 31.—The police early yesterday, discovered a supposed bomb with a tube attached, containing a lighted fuse in front of the house of Prince Troubetsky, an Attaché of the Russian Embassy here. The police extinguished the fuse and informed the authorities, who are investigating the affair.

The bomb was bottle-shaped and of small dimensions. It was filled with a green powder. There were two tubes in the centre, one of metal and the other of glass, containing acid. Owing to faulty construction the acid would not mix with the powder and it is believed the bomb could not have done great damage.

A meeting was held last evening in

the Tivoli, Vauxhall, to protest against the ukase. It was under the auspices of revolutionary socialist groups and six thousand persons were present. Deputies Jaures, Vaillant and Depressence spoke. The police were present in strong force. During the exit of the audience into Avenue de La Republique, a bomb was thrown into the centre of the group of Police Republican guards, in which stood Prefect Lepine and other high officials.

COUNT TOLSTOI ON RUSSIA'S TROUBLES

The Original Philosopher Uses Many Words and Says Nothing Very Definite—His Views Given in a Recent Despatch From Michael Davitt, the Irish Leader, Dated Moscow.

New York, Feb. 3.—Tolstoi, the Russian author's views on the recent bloodshed in St. Petersburg are given in this despatch from Michael Davitt, the Irish leader, to the American, dated Moscow, January 31.

Count Tolstoi's statement to the correspondent is as follows: "The news from St. Petersburg is shocking, but I have not yet received a full account of the awful events. I have been inundated with telegrams from newspapers and individuals all over the world requesting an expression of my views on these events.

"It is impossible to give an adequate answer to such an important question in a few words; furthermore I have at different times expressed my views on such questions as of a people trying by force to better their condition. Under the influence of recent events I have made sundry notes which will later serve as the basis of a comprehensive article on the subject. The tenor of these notes is this:

"A government, whether monarchial, constitutional or republican, are nothing more than organized institutions which themselves bring immense pain and punishment, have the power to punish others, to plunder and to rob. Neither the working classes nor the intelligent classes of Russians are true exponents of the real desires and needs of the people. The programme which they submit to the government is not the programme of the people. Those elementary measures which they demand of the government, such as freedom of person, freedom of speech, and freedom of conscience, etc., though essentially conditions for a life of culture, do not touch the problem of the crying need of the people, which lies solely in the nationalization and communism of land. On this point neither the workingmen nor the educated classes raise the cry, nor do we hear any cry from the people of other lands, despite James

the apparent freedom of these countries. In other countries there exists the so-called independent press, but its independence is only apparent.

We have only to observe the fate which attended the plan advocated by Henry George for the nationalization of land. The only possibility of a change in the general policy of civilization lies in perfecting the individual morally and religiously. Then through the development of the individual, through moral improvement, through inoculation of respect for others, through hatred of force, cruelty and injustice to others will disappear."
