LONDON TO BUILD NEW GAME CENTRE

(By the Canadian Press) LONDON, Jan. 17—A great new centre of amusement and recreation is to be built where the Haymarket joins Coventry Street, 50 yards from Piccadilly Circus. It will be called the Arcadium. An indoor "Lido," with swimming pool and real waves, dining, dancing and cabaret halls, will be included in the scheme. Other features are a health centre, baths of all kinds, massage, electrical and sunlight treatments, squash racquet courts, a glass-enclosed palm court and open terraces laid out as Italian gardens. A raised terrace round the swimming pool will accommodate 600 people for refreshments, and among other novel entertainments, a "water cabaret" is promised. From the wide entrance hall spectators will take visitors to all the five floors, where there is room for more than 5,000 people.
