### Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or of any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Office or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts, or may purchase a homestead in good lands. He may purchase a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years, cultivation of the land, and a house worth \$500.
