THE BEST KEPT SCHOOL GROUNDS—The Canadian Horticultural Society's cup, which was donated by His Honor Lieutenant Governor Heath for the best kept school grounds in the province, will be presented to West Royalty School, its winner for this year next Thursday afternoon at 2.30 p. m. With the cup goes the certificate of the Horticultural Society. There is also a \$5.00 prize for the best essay by a pupil on the improvement of school grounds, but it is not yet announced who the winner is.

ADDRESS ON ILLUMINATION—Last night in the Board of Trade rooms an address on illumination was delivered to a number of the merchants of the city, who had been invited for the occasion, by Mr. E. W. Jeffrey, illuminating engineer of the Northern Electric Company. He had previously delivered his lecture before the Engineering Institutes in Moncton and Sydney, and the Engineering Societies at St. John's and the University of New Brunswick at Fredericton.

The purpose of the talk was to show how to use incandescent lamps to gain the maximum efficiency for the purpose in view. In the course of his remarks he laid particular stress on incandescent units as an excellent means of accomplishing this end.
