Farnel, O'Hara, commanded by Captain McLean, arrived in port on Tuesday with a cargo of coal from Sydney, consigned to Wright Bros.—V.

**FOUND.**—The missing gasoline boat which the D. G. S. Brant went in search of on Wednesday, as reported in yesterday's Guardian, has been found. The boat, which belonged to Mr. Morrow, of Annandale, who was accompanied by two Georgetown men Angus McLean and Jack Yoston, had set out on Tuesday night, with a raft of logs in tow, from Wood Islands for Georgetown; but up to mid-day on Wednesday, when the assistance of the Brant was requisitioned, had not reached her destination. The Brant found her at three o'clock that afternoon off Wood Islands breakwater. The raft was too heavy for the boat to tow, and she was just drifting about, and in all probability would have been lost had not the Brant turned up at such a timely period. The steamer towed the boat and the raft in safety to Georgetown.

**DEPUTATION TO GOV.**—The Executive Council at its meeting on Wednesday received a deputation from the Summerside Board of Trade. The delegation consisted of Dr. McLellan, Messrs. W. H. B. Stavert and W. J. Lidstone, and the object with which they waited on the Government was the procuring of a suitable building in Summerside for the purpose of holding seed fairs. At present there is no permanent building for these fairs to be held in this town, and the Board of Trade there desire the Government to furnish such a building. Their application was favourably received, and is being considered by the Government, with it is understood, considerable desire to comply with their wishes. It is further understood that the intention of the Government is, if it is decided to provide a building, to make it utilisable as a general agricultural hall and not confined to the purpose of seed fairs only.
