### NEW RUSSIAN PARTY STARTED IN LONDON

LONDON, May 28.—The anti-religious policy of the Soviet government and the general situation in the Russian Empire, which have set up a new state of ferment in Russian circles of London and the continent.

The result has been to bring in to being a new Russian group, the National Progressive Party, which recently held a meeting in London. It was then declared that the aim of the party was to work for the holding eventually in Russia of a great national plebiscite which should set up a Constitution, which would restore to the people of Russia the complete freedom of religious life; respect of persons, property and trade; open trade for all the most part, however, noblemen in supporting religious toleration and freedom of trade, which were never known in pre-war Russia, is the real feature which makes the party a popular one among the exiles. Any mention of the restoration of the Russian royal family has been avoided.

### SWEDEN PLANS DRASTIC CUT IN MILITARY OUTLAY

STOCKHOLM, May 28.—A reduction of the Swedish army by half, and a considerable reduction of the number of all Swedish vessels except those of the battleship class, has just been recommended to the government by a special commission on the revision of the national defence policy.

Seedy and chaffy fleeces even if the wool is of good quality cannot be put in the regular grades and have to be thrown in to the discard, in many cases, however, the exercise of care at shearing will save a fleece from the seedy grade.

Wool qualities vary in all fleeces. The neck and shoulder wool is clean is the finest and most valuable. The back and side are medium and the hind quarters are the poorest. The best part of the fleece, the clean side, is always whiter and more attractive than the outer side of the fleece.

Quality sells the product in wool, as in all other farm products. The Dominion Live Stock Branch provides expert wool graders for the grading of all wool consigned for co-operative sale. Graded wool always sells for the highest market price.

Co-operative selling of wool has stood the test of years of high and low wool markets and has infancy, four regiments of cavalry, and one regiment of artillery, and by requiring a smaller number of conscripts, to make up a regiment.

### SHIP'S LIQUOR PART OF REGULAR SUPPLIES

WASHINGTON, May 27.—Great Britain's position on the ship liquor question as communicated to the State Department today by the British embassy is understood to be based on a contention that the United States port authorities have no jurisdiction in international law over liquor brought into United States waters as a part of the regular supplies of foreign vessels.
