Americans Hunting Gold Brave Rigors Of Siberia

VLADIVOSTOK, Oct. 8.—Up in northern Siberia, several miles inland from the Hukon, a band of Americans are "panning" the river beds for gold as their fathers did in the California and other mining camps of the west 70 years ago. Last winter there were 35 of them, but about half the number came out this year and all will not return. They have not made any big discoveries, such as those which caused the rushes to the west from '49 onwards, but they have made a good living and have always before them the dream of riches which, through centuries, has kept prospectors at their calling.

There are also a large number of Chinese and Korean placer miners in the country and latterly, an entirely new undertaking for them, Japanese have been taking a hand in the ever entrancing work. Some of the latter have gone 300 miles inland, and the miners along the coast are awaiting eagerly the reports of their discoveries, if any.

There is also an American trading station at Okhotsk, the manager of which is Captain D. A. Holmes, formerly of the United States army. Besides supplying the miners and natives, this station engages in the fishing industry and sells its catches to the Japanese canneries.

The Soviet officials, who are in control, do not interfere with the miners, fishermen or traders as long as they do not mix in Russian politics. Thus far no taxes have been levied on the miners, who work any and all claims despite the fact that a concession for mining in this district was given a British company.

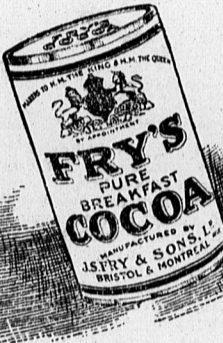

Model Town in Michigan Sold To Henry Ford

L'ANSE Mich., Oct. 9.—Pequaming, nine miles to the north of L'Anse, is Henry Ford's town. The highest rent there is \$1 a month. electric light and water are furnished at cost, the doctor's bill is never more than \$1.50 a month and fuel famines are unknown.

The Detroit automobile manufacturer acquired possession of Pequaming recently from Charles Hebard and Sons, Inc., pioneer lumbermen of the peninsula.

When the town was built in 1877 the owners set about to make it something different from other lumber towns. They wanted a community of comfortable homes and happy, contented workmen. They seemed to think more of the welfare of their employes than they did of the profits of their enterprise.

workmen, two churches—one Protestant and one Catholic—an amusement hall, a school, a clubhouse, a waterworks and electric lighting plant, a telephone system, a general store where all residents shop, and a public playground and park.

Each workman pays the same rent—\$1 a month. He need never worry about coal, for he burns none. Instead he stuffs his big stove with hardwood from the company's forests, paying \$1.75 for a large wagonload—barely the cost of cutting and delivering. A doctor administers to the ill of the community at a charge of \$1.50 a month.

The beauty of Pequaming has won frequent comment from tourists. The streets are well shaded, the houses are of varying types, and there is a garden with every house. Purchase of the town gives Mr. Ford ownership of the sawmill property of the Hebard corporation. This includes a large saw mill, lath and shingle mills, and 40,000 acres of land containing

400,000,000 feet of standing timber.

The saw mill is the third purchase of Ford since his invasion of the Upper Peninsula, and the second was at L'Anse.

The Pequaming purchase makes the Detroit manufacturer the largest single taxpayer in Baraga. He will pay about three-fourths of the taxes of the entire county.

Mr. Ford has not announced what policy he will follow at Pequaming, or whether he will continue the Hebard program that has made Pequaming a model town.
