

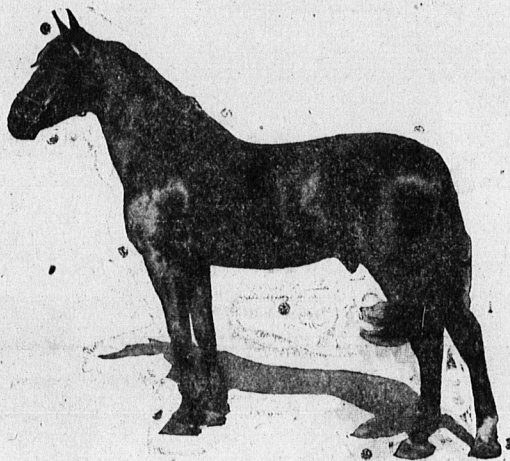
FURIOUS STORM IN SAINT JOHN
