The Glorious November 21

Sir: November, 21, 1918 was undoubtedly the greatest day in the history of the British Empire—aye of the world—in that it saw the ignominious surrender of the German Navy to the German Fleet and marked the death-knell of the German dream of ascendancy on the seas. As it seems certain that we shall have an annual celebration of the day when the armistice was signed and fighting ended, it would not be possible to have another holiday so soon afterwards, but I would venture to submit that we in Canada should set an example to the rest of the Empire and establish November 21 each year (or the school day nearest to that date) as a day when in all our schools the glory of our Navy should be taught to the rising generation. We have celebrated Trafalgar day in a sort of a fashion in the past; let us now determine to commemorate each year a day which is far greater in importance than even the anniversary of Trafalgar. I trust that the various Departments of Education will take up this suggestion and put it into force.

In any case, the school children of today should have a section of one day before the Christmas holidays set apart in which they may be told of the historic incidents which took place in the Firth of Forth on November 21. The Superintendents of Education could easily prepare a syllabus out of Sir David Beatty's messages to his Glorious Fleet.

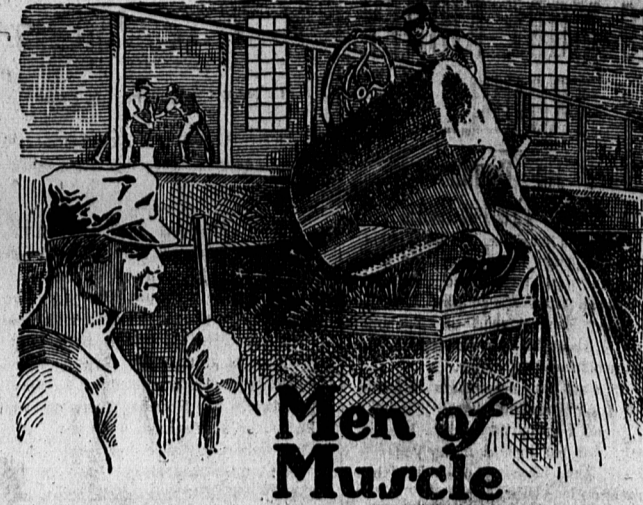
