RADIO EQUIPMENT ON BOARD "THE INTERNATIONAL LIMITED"

The latest train on the Canadian National Railways System to be equipped with radio receiving sets is "The International Limited," the crack passenger train running daily between Montreal and Chicago. This train left Montreal on Saturday with radio equipment attached to the observation car. In addition to the loud speaker, there were attached to this set, eight pairs of head phones. The advantage of these is that in the event that there are passengers who do not desire to take advantage of the radio programmes, it is possible to silence the loud speaker and allow the other passengers to enjoy the concert by means of the head phones. This style of equipment will be standardized throughout the System. The transcontinental trains of the Canadian National Railways are now equipped with radio receiving sets and all the important passenger trains will be similarly equipped as early as possible.

The Atlantic Park Hotel, at Southampton, England, run by the Canadian Pacific, White Star and Cunard Lines, is an up-to-the-minute detention station, which is used to house emigrants from Europe bound for this side of the Atlantic and whom it may be necessary to hold for a time. It has all the modern conveniences for the comfortable housing of emigrants, special kitchens for preparing "kosher" food for those of the Jewish faith, second and third-class bedrooms, gymnasium, tennis courts, study rooms, theatre, shower baths and the apparatus for disinfecting clothes. He almost ranks as the dean of American War correspondents in point of length of service, and easily is the best. Beginning as far back as the Spanish War, he has reported troubles big and little from Central America to Manchuria and back again; always with a deft, sure touch, a keen eye for color and the dramatic savor in the grim business of war and high-est qualification of all he always gets there first with the news. It's a sore temptation to name him, but I shall not for reasons which make this story. In a nutshell those reasons can be compacted into a few words. Our hero is the most expensive war correspondent in history. Not in terms of salary, though he commands a high one; but in the matter of expense accounts. No man in the field ever has been so prodigal with his employer's money in the way of getting where he wants to go with the greatest expedition and least physical discomfort. The subject of this sketch is impeccably honest but gorgeously extravagant; dollars mean nothing to him when he is on the job and delivering the goods. During the Russo-Japanese quarrel in Manchuria, our modern Midas was attached to the Japanese army. His requisitions on the home office were sufficient to cause the managing editor to tear his hair. Finally the latter cabled, "No more money unless itemized expense account rendered." In course of time a cable from some outpost in Manchuria laid on the managing editor's desk: "Regret report itemized expense account covering entire campaign hit by Russian shell. Mail which was carrying it destroyed too."
