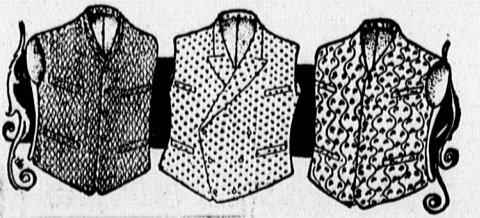

PLAN A GIANT LUMBER MERGER

ST. LOUIS, Mo., July 11.—Planning to merge their lumber interest into one great holding corporation capitalized at approximately \$300,000,000, one hundred wealthy lumbermen from the Yellow Pine Belt of the South and West met here at the Mercantile Club and discussed an organization plan looking toward that end. F. E. Weyerhaeuser, of St. Paul, Minn., son of the multi-millionaire lumberman, was appointed chairman of the permanent organization committee which is to work out the details of organization, the financing and the drafting of a charter and the legal phases of the plan. The organization committee is expected to raise \$25,000,000 from the proprietary interests to consummate the merger of interests.

BERESFORD MAY GO TO PARLIAMENT

LONDON, July 11.—The morning newspapers regard Premier Asquith's statement in parliament regarding the dissensions among naval officers as warning to Admiral Lord Charles Beresford and other naval malcontents. The Daily News prints a guarded statement that Admiral Beresford has addressed to the admiralty a strongly worded memorandum, that with an inadequate fleet under his command he is unable to guarantee the security of the kingdom from foreign attack. The Daily News suggests that this ultimatum means that the admiral intends to resign and seek a seat in parliament with a view to attacking the government's naval policy.

THREE OFFICERS BEHEADED.

SAIGON, Cochinchina, July 11.—The three Annamite officers, condemned to death for complicity in a plot to poison the members of the garrison, have been beheaded at Hanoi. Two hundred members of the garrison were taken ill recently and an examination of their drinking water showed the presence of poison.

MONTREAL, July 11.—The Star prints a sensational statement from J. G. Merrick, acting head of the C. A. A. U., in the absence of President Starke. Mr. Merrick states that the cause of all the trouble over Longboat's entry being accepted is fear that there is not a man in the United States who can successfully compete against him. He further states that all kinds of traps were laid to professionalize Longboat which would disqualify him and open up a chance for such cherished victory by United States. U. has been unable to find a flaw in Longboat's record which would disqualify him and this ought to be proof enough of his good standing for the British Olympic committee.
