WEST QUEENS.

Although the weather is warm—"too warm for politics," as Hon. Mr. Foster has observed—the time is not inauspicious for the people of West Queens to quietly deliberate upon the choice of a representative to succeed Sir Louis Davies in the House of Commons. The large Liberal majority given in the riding at the last election, together with the fact that the Laurier Government appear to be firmly entrenched at Ottawa for the present at least, renders it probable that the united choice of the party will succeed in the coming election. Much therefore will depend upon the choice of a candidate who may be finally and definitely nominated.

So far two names have been prominently mentioned as candidates, the first in order of newspaper reference being Mr. Horace Hazard, and more recently a requisition was presented to Hon. D. Farquharson. Both these gentlemen have been active and useful in party work, as well as in business affairs and both are held in high regard by the Island Liberals generally. Many men in the party would be glad to see either one or both of them receive political or official preferment. It is doubtless a source of embarrassment to some persons to make a choice between them for the position of standard-bearer in West Queens at the present time. On this matter the party journals are not, for obvious reasons, in a position to give interested advice and it comes clearly within the province of an independent newspaper to throw such light as it may upon the existing conditions.

It may help to clear the ground if we frankly outline some salient features of the situation. We are informed and believe that Mr. Farquharson aspires to be our next Executive Chief when the term of His Honor, Lieutenant Governor McIntyre shall have expired, say three years hence. In that regard we believe his aspirations are quite in agreement with the views and wishes of the Island Liberals and with the consent and expectation of the people generally. So much being conceded, the election of Mr. Farquharson as a member of the Commons would be for only a brief term. He would, in fact, hardly become thoroughly acquainted with his new duties and his new associates at Ottawa when he would step down and out, at what would be an inconvenient time, probably involving the necessity of a by-election to again fill the seat in the Commons. It is too well known to need any argument in that behalf that no representative however capable he may be can attain to his full measure of usefulness and efficiency in the first few years of his service in that capacity. Would it not therefore be a mistake to select a representative for a brief term when another is available who would have before him many years to devote to our federal affairs, with the ambition and the prospect of making a noteworthy public career? It was by the political weight and momentum acquired during long years in the federal arena that Sir Louis Davies became so influential and useful as he has shown himself to be.

A little reflection we think will suggest to almost any one the unwisdom of filling the seat so long and ably filled by Sir Louis Davies with another who would confessedly be a mere locum tenens, and holding the place merely for a brief term and as a stepping stone to the Governorship. Such a course would not probably promote even Mr. Farquharson's interest or assist in bringing about the official preferment which he desires. At the same time it would not be fair to Mr. Hazard to be asked to step aside and wait while Mr. Farquharson should fill the Ottawa seat as a matter of personal desire or convenience, without prospect or purpose of remaining our representative there. Moreover Premier Farquharson is needed in his present position, to lead the Gov-

ernment of the Island and to administer the important new legislation which he has introduced and carried. Should he now retire from the Provincial Government the succession of the leadership is by no means free from difficulty. He is so thoroughly conversant with our Island affairs, has given them so much painstaking attention, and has in recent years filled so prominent a place in the Legislature and Government, that all must feel he could ill be spared from his post at the present moment, and there is no one in his party who could fill it so well.

We doubt not that the party and Mr. Farquharson also, will come to see that the true interests of the constituency, of the Island, of the party now in control of our affairs and of the Premier himself will best be served by his remaining where he is. Equally we doubt not that the majority of the electorate will yet conclude that it is in the best interests of all concerned to select as a successor to Sir Louis one who is so well qualified in every way for the position as Mr. Hazard and one who would have before him the prospect of being for many years to come the capable, and increasingly useful and influential representative of the people. It is needless to add that in making these observations THE GUARDIAN speaks only for itself and for the people, in the most friendly spirit toward all and without inspiration from any person or party.
