French Aviators Delivered Mail In Buenos Aires
(Special to the Guardian)
BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 21.—For the first time in history, residents of the Argentine capital today were able to read letters and newspapers ten days after they were mailed in Europe, a saving of from six to nine days over the usual time, as a result of the 6,000 mile cruise of two French aviators from Paris to Buenos Aires. Diudonne Costes and Lieut. Libreaux who were in French capital Oct 10th, arrived in Buenos Aires today with the first regular mails.

Mount Stewart Notes
Rapid progress is being made on the new road which is under construction, only requiring the opening of the R. R. tracks and a barrier at the side of a small field belonging to the estate of the late Kimble Coffin, to make it a through road from Clark's corner, Mt. Stewart, to McDonald's Corner, Maple Hill. Then a culvert and the R. R. Crossing being put in, would finish it, excepting for the gravel, etc., with which it is to be covered. As it seems, some of the road, the first being Mr. Percy A. Fleck, mail carrier, and the second, Mr. Fred Leard in his Dodge car.

Greatest Fear Of Woman, 102, Is To Be Old
HOGKAY, Minn., Oct. 21.—As she lighted the 102 candle on her birthday cake today, Mrs. Dorothy Reed Smith Dunham said her greatest fear in life was that she would "live to be old."

She received the townfolk during the day as she had at her 100th and 101st birthdays and they planned a similar celebration for next year. Congratulatory letters and telegrams came from all parts of the country.

British Cruiser In Solomon Islands

SUVA, Fiji Islands, Oct. 21.—The British cruiser Adelaide has anchored at Singapore, Malaita Island, in the Solomon group, and landed a party of sailors who will operate with the local authorities from Malaita to punish the perpetrators of the recent massacre, in which several officers including white persons, were killed. Although details of the uprising are still lacking, it is reported the murders were committed by members of two tribes, some 200 to 300 natives of Malaita taking part.

Barber Convicted Of Murdering Girl At Beach Resort
SALEM, Mass., Oct. 21.—A verdict of guilty of murder in the first degree was returned by a jury this afternoon against George E. Taylor, for the killing of Stella Pomikale, of Lawrence at Salisbury Beach on June 6th last.

Prince George Resumes Career As Sailor
(Special to the Guardian)
PORTSMOUTH, Eng., Oct. 21.—Old sea dogs of the British navy stroked their beards in glee today when Prince George resumed his active career as a sailor, for there had been reports that he might forsake the navy for the army. The Prince who ranks as a Lieutenant, is now attached as French interpreter to the staff of Sir Hubert Brand, Commander-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet—a job which will pay him one shilling and six pence or about 36 cents a day, in addition to his regular pay as an officer.

Prince George will be stationed aboard H. M. S. Nelson, Britain's newest battle ship, which became the fleet flagship today, the anniversary of Nelson's historic victory over the French Spanish fleet off Cape Trafalgar 122 years ago. Just before starting for Portsmouth last night the Prince witnessed a spect-

acular film fire which was his own experience in China on New Year's evening 1926, when he was attached to H. M. S. Hawkins and with other members of the crew fought a Hong Kong fire, aiding guests to escape.

Luck Of The Red Diamond
(By British United Press.)
PARIS, October 24.—A mysterious red diamond—said to be the only one in the world—is being recut in Amsterdam.

The diamond, which is of perfect purity has an extraordinary history.

A few years ago it belonged to a Hungarian nobleman, a strange personage known in all the casinos of the Riviera as "the man with the red diamond."

He wore this diamond in a huge platinum ring, and superstitious players believed it was the cause of his extraordinary good luck at the tables.

A baccarat, roulette and trente et quarante, indeed, he never seemed to lose, and the sums he netted, were considerable.

One day on leaving the casino at Monte Carlo he fell on the steps and the red diamond was slightly chipped.

On the following day he handed it to a Dutch diamond merchant to be recut. That afternoon the nobleman went to a play club and lost a millions francs at baccarat.

In the evening he was one of a boating party, and in the course of the trip he fell overboard and was drowned.

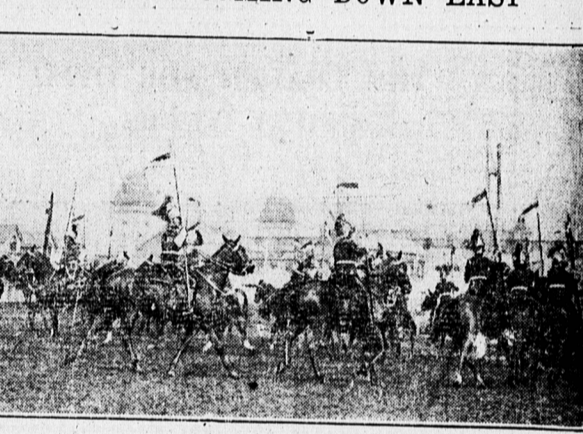

Mass. Woman Found Murdered In Villa In French Riviera
NICE, France, Oct. 21.—Captain Wenceslas De Krupfoll said to have formerly been connected with the Russian Imperial guard, was arrested here this evening charged with the murder of Mme. Marcelle Lord, the wife of Horace W. Lord, of Fall River, Mass.

The body of Mme. Lord was found in a villa today with a stab wound through the heart. DeKrupfoll was known to have been visiting at the villa but was not in the apartment when the murder was discovered. Immediately a search was instituted for him and he was taken into custody not far from the scene, while attempting to call on a friend of Mme. Lord's.

The police declare that Krupfoll made a full avowal, saying that Mme. Lord had tried to stop him from committing suicide and he killed her—he did not remember how. The police investigation shows that Mme. Lord became acquainted with the Captain last year at Grasse near Nice, where both were members of a German "back to nature" cult, which was suppressed by the authorities.

Premier Ferguson Back From Winnipeg
TORONTO, Oct. 21.—The conference of provincial premiers and cabinet ministers, which is to convene shortly at Ottawa for the annual discussion of problems relating to uniform taxation laws and other problems, will urge upon the federal government reconstruction of the findings of the dominion railway board in the application of provinces for a lower rate for Alberta coal coming east. This statement was made by Premier Ferguson to the Telegram upon arrival in Toronto this morning from Winnipeg. He arrived at the Union station in his private car the "Timagami" on the 8:15 C. P. R. He was met by Attorney General Price, with whom he had a conference on the private car before leaving the station.
