FIRE AT PEMBROKE

PEMBROKE, Ont., October 4—One of the worst fires in the history of Pembroke, entailing a loss of some \$60,000, took place yesterday, when the valuable Hunter property on Main street, extending from the corner of McKay and Pembroke streets to the Griffiths Brothers' building, was burned to the ground.

The losses are:—W. A. Hunter and Sons, dry goods and groceries, \$25,000 on stock, with \$10,000 insurance; and \$10,000 on building, with \$4,000 insurance; S. N. Hunter, hardware, \$10,000 loss, covered by insurance; W. St. James, barber, \$300 loss covered by insurance; Robert Strutt, shoe man, \$600 loss, with \$300 insurance; George Chambers, fruit and confectionery, loss \$800 on stock and \$1,200 on house, with \$800 insurance.
