-The meeting of the Woodstock District was held at Hartland, N. B., Rev R. W. Weddall presiding. The reports show that the present membership for the District is 1084. -On Sunday the 5th inst Rev Geo. Steel, Bedeque, gave the right hand of fellowship at Seartown to four boys, and a mother. There was a large number at the Lord's Table. During the day he baptized four infants and one next morning. At the fourth meeting of the Quarterly Official Board the Rev G. Steel was voted a bonus of \$50.00 out of the surplus in hand, and words of appreciation were spoken by nearly every member of the Board. Wesleyan.

-The Railway freight shed at Tignish was broken into and a case of liquor, a quantity of beer and some other goods stolen therefrom on Sunday the 13th inst. Suspicion rested on three suspicious looking characters and the agent, Mr. Arsenault, had warrants issued on Tuesday last for the three of them which were placed in the hands of Constable White of Alberton and Police Officer Mathieson of the P. E. I. R., who on Friday last succeeded in capturing one of the suspects, a man named George McFadyen, aged about thirty-five years. The officers rounded him up about five miles from Tignish in the woods and, when discovered had with him five bottles of liquor, some beer and a hard looking revolver, not as dangerous as it looked. The prisoner was brought to Summerside by Officer Mathieson on Saturday morning and taken before Stipendiary Wright who remanded him to jail until Wednesday next for hearing.

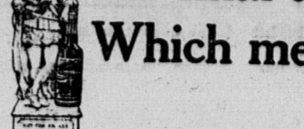

T. TRENHOLM AND F. L. CAMERON PART

(Continued from page 1.) TRENHOLM TALKS OF SEPARATION.

The Herald correspondent had an interview today with T. Trenholm, the well known trainer, who has been associated with Fred S. Cameron ever since the latter began his victorious career, the climax of which was reached when he won the great Boston Marathon on April 19th.

Cameron was defeated four times last year by Sterling of St. John. Those meets were early in the year and Trenholm, seeing the excellent showing Cameron made became interested and took him in charge. Under his training, Cameron developed rapidly and in all the numerous meets in which he has since participated has never lost a race, which is a high compliment to his own ability and Trenholm's efficient method of training.

Early last fall Trenholm told your correspondent that Cameron was going to bring the Boston Marathon cup to Nova Scotia. He made a similar statement to a number of others, but all doubted. Even Cameron's most sanguine friends did not believe that he had the capacity to enter a Marathon contest. Trenholm knew what he was talking about as evidenced by the result.

Asked about their plans for the approaching summer, Trenholm stated that he and Cameron had parted company. They had agreed to disagree. Some difference of opinion had come between them and although they were still good friends in every sense of the word, he had ceased to be his trainer.

PAYS HIGH TRIBUTE TO CAMERON'S ABILITY.

Mr. Trenholm paid a high tribute to Cameron's ability as a runner. He had the satisfaction of knowing that the champion was in as good condition, if not better, than when placed in his hands. A runner could not be developed to his best in one season without overtaxing him and he had been careful not to push Cameron forward too rapidly. "He should be better than ever this summer," was the remark of his old trainer, "if he is only as careful in the future as in the past and continues to pursue the same method of training as he had at my hands."
