The Scotsman's Baggage.

MONTREAL, Dec. 5.—There were some interesting scenes at the office of the Dominion Line this morning occasioned by the number of claimants of baggage which had been salvaged from the wreck of the S. S. Scotsman. One applicant wanted two bicycles, and after a careful hunt through the whole lot they were found not much the worse for their experience. There were three wheels saved from the wreck and when it is recalled under what circumstances these articles were rescued, the captain and crew deserve great credit. All this baggage was hauled up from the hold of the ship at a time when she was liable to sink at any moment, and without the assistance of any steam power.

A large wicker trunk, which belonged to the unfortunate Mrs. Childs, of the 'Sign of the Cross' Company, who was drowned, was found to-day. Large quantities of Mr. Westerton's baggage was also found. He, it may also be remembered was the young man who sang hymns and in other ways cheered the discouraged passengers when on the rocks at Belle Isle. Numbers of these valuable trunks were not fastened in any way than by a rope, so that the utmost honesty must have prevailed when nothing in all the two hundred pieces has been found disturbed. Mr. McFarlane and the staff of the passenger department are very busy distributing this baggage and answering enquiries. Many of the passengers have enquired thinking erroneously that some baggage was saved from the stragglers.

White Pine Disappearing.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Dec. 5. According to the best estimates available there are now 7,000,000,000 ft of white pine still standing within the borders of the State of Minnesota.

When it is stated further that this pine is melting away at the rate of 1,500,000,000 ft every year, it requires but a minute's computation to demonstrate that this industry is rapidly drawing to a close and that, in another 5 yrs of the present rate of consumption continues, an end will have been reached to the lumber business of the State.

The mills of Minnesota will cut almost 120,000,000 ft of lumber this year than in any that has preceded it, and preparations are making for an even larger output for next season.
