THE BODY GIVES OFF RAYS.

Quite as wonderful as the X rays, or radium itself is the fact recently discovered by M. Charpentier, a French scientist, that the human body gives off rays of its own.

The N rays transmitted from the nerves or muscles of the human body pass freely through glass, aluminum or paper, but are stopped by such substances as lead or wet paper.

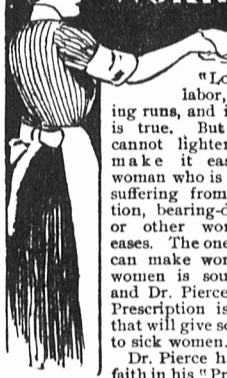
The discoverer thought it possible at first that the emanations of N rays from the human body might have resulted from the rays having first been absorbed from sunlight.

But it is observed that nerve centres, nerves and muscles, and these in proportion to their activity, are the centres of emanation of the N rays.

Bye and bye, when there is a neurometer, psychometer or N ray meter devised, and such an instrument must be forthcoming we shall be able perhaps to measure the strength of these emanations from different persons, and therewith ascertain the strength of their nervous and muscular activity.
